

The Department welcomes enquiries and requests from business organizations, government, voluntary bodies or private institutions for specially designed courses to meet their specific educational needs.

PRIOR ENROLMENT IS ESSENTIAL

Failure to enrol prior to the opening of a particular course may mean the cancellation of that course. Prior enrolment is the only way the Department of Extra-Mural Studies has of judging the response to its courses. Your co-operation is therefore invited in sending your application forms to the Department as soon as possible.

GENERAL INFORMATION

- 1. There are normally no entry requirements except that applicants should be over 18 years of age. Occasionally to have the full benefit of a course applicants must possess certain defined qualifications. Applicants are therefore advised to read the description of a course carefully. Professional courses usually have clearly defined entry requirements.
- 2. The Director may at his discretion refuse to admit an applicant.
- 3. Unless otherwise arranged, no Extra-Mural lectures will be held:
 - (a) on any public holidays.
 - (b) at a storm warning signal of No. 5 or above. (After the typhoon passes, if the No. 5 signal is lowered before 3 p.m., classes will take place as normal. If the signal is lowered after 3 p.m., classes will be cancelled that evening.)
 - (c) during the following holiday period: February 2–8, 1973, inclusive (Lunar New Year).
- 4. Fees are not refundable once the course has commenced.
- 5. Certificate of Attendance are issued, on payment of 50 cents, to those who have attended not less than two-thirds of a course of at least 20 meetings in duration.
- 6. Closing date for enrolment: one week before the starting date of a course. Late enrolments may not be accepted.

164. A Review of the Prehistory of Hong Kong. James C. Y. Watt, M.A. (Oxon.). Curator, Art Gallery and Museum. Institute of Chinese Studies, Chinese University of Hong Kong. Wednesdays, 6.00–8.00 p.m., starting February 14, 1973. Extra-Mural Town Centre. 3 meetings. Fee: \$30

Mr. Watt will review the prehistory of Hong Kong as currently accepted in the light of recent research and various discoveries in mainland China and in S.E. Asia generally. Particular reference will be made to contributions to knowledge made by new material found in Thailand as well as the new ideas generated by mainland finds, which the lecturer has just visited.

Preference will be given to those people who have attended Dr. Bard's basic course in previous years. Please state on your application if you have attended one of these courses.

Enrolment will be limited to 25 persons to allow time for discussion. This course was postponed from last term because of the absence of the tutor from the Colony.

UNIVERSITY ENTRANCE

167. Certificate Course in Fundamentals of Art & Design

A daytime course extending over one and a half years of 4 terms of 10 weeks duration. Formal instruction is concentrated into three or four days per week, but considerable additional private work will be necessary.

The object of this foundation level course is to provide a range of studies and understanding which will enable students, whatever the nature of their previous education, to gain an opportunity to develop talents and discover interests in the field of Art & Design.

Fee: \$2000

Enrolment is limited to 25 persons.

Entry Requirements: Consideration will be given to those who have an interest in Art & Design and proficiency in English up to at least the level of the Hong Kong English School Certificate, Grade E.

The syllabus outline is as follows:

- 1. Consideration and evaluation of Visual Criteria.
- 2. History of Western Art and Architecture with concentration on 19th and 20th centuries. History of Oriental Art and Architecture, including techniques.
- 3. An understanding of Man as an individual, and Man in Society in relation to Design expression.
- 4. Understanding of the Nature of Materials and Visual and Tactile relationships and values. Colour theory.
- 5. Drawing Techniques both free and mechanical, Life Drawing.
- Studio: Two Dimensional Studies ranging from Painting to Printmaking.
- 7. Studio: Three Dimensional Studies ranging from Sculpture and Construction to Design problems.

The course consists of formal lectures, seminars and discussions and considerable studio work.

PRACTICAL PRINTMAKING; DRAWING AND PANTING

These are practical classes in the visual arts with emphasis on imaginative painting or drawing, designed to encourage growth of individual creative powers. Work will be carried on in the various media described. Instruction is individual as classes are restricted in size. Enrolment is open to students at different stages, beginners being particularly welcome.

Materials will be discussed at the initial meeting in each class and students must provide all materials necessary or buy the same through the department.

In cases where a model is used an additional fee will be charged.

168. Painting in Oil & Acrylic. Miss Cissy P. L. Pao, B.A., B.F.A. (Washington). Tuesdays, 6.00-10.00 p.m., starting February 13, 1973. Extra-Mural Town Centre. 20 meetings. Fee: \$280

Although the concentration of effort in this course will be on painting, there will be an introductory period of analysis of alternate ways of perception, of consideration of the subject matter of a painting in terms of tone, line or volume as well as examination of fundamental colour relationships. The course is designed for beginners and will include instruction in the preparation of canvases and choice of materials, which students will be expected to provide themselves.

Enrolment will be limited to 20 persons.

169. Life Drawing. Michael F. Griffith, A.T.D. Thursdays, 6.00-8.00 p.m., starting February 15, 1973. Extra-Mural Town Centre. 10 meetings. Fee: \$100

A course in life drawing from the model. Development of individual techniques will be encouraged and the acquisition of a basic knowledge of anatomy regarded as essential.

An additional fee of \$25 will be charged for the model.

170. 版畫製作:石版畫與金屬蝕刻 (Printmaking: Lithography and Etching)

Commerce & Management

The courses in this section are aimed at all levels of industry, commerce and the public service. They are designed for two types of student:

- (a) Those who wish to prepare for professional examinations.
- (b) Those who wish to acquire skills and knowledge appropriate to their present responsibilities and future development.

Some courses are more advanced than others and require prior participation in basic courses for admission. In particular, students are advised not to enter for courses geared to examination requirements unless they already have a basic knowledge of the subject and fully intend to take the examination.

There will be other courses arranged during the year at the request of professional societies and industrial firms for which details cannot now be given. Suggestions or proposals for courses are welcome. The Department is always willing to consider arranging special courses for members of a particular firm or organisation or for a group of such bodies.

171. Structure of Commerce. Neil Carr, B.A., M.A., Dip.A.D., Fridays, 7.00–8.30 p.m., starting February 23, 1973. Lecture Room South, 8/F., City Hall. 6 meetings. Fee: \$45

Subjects to be discussed in this course include the nature and scope of commercial activity, the main commercial functions, including exchange, transport and storage, finance, risk-bearing. Supply and demand, and their effect on price under conditions of competition and monopoly. Money, bills of exchange, methods of payment and foreign exchange. The balance of payments and International Trade. Banks and their main services. Business ownership, control, the provision of capital, its use and the relationship of capital, stock, turnover, expenses and profit.

This course is specifically related to the needs of candidates who intend to take the Part I Examination for Associateship of the Institute of Chartered Shipbrokers.

172. An Introduction to Law for the Businessman. Raymond Faulkner, B.A. (Cantab.), Barrister-at-Law, Lecturer in Law, University of Hong Kong. Mondays, 8.15-9.45 p.m., starting February 12, 1973. Extra Mural Town Centre. 12 meetings. Fee: \$60

This course is intended for businessmen for whom a knowledge of the Law as it relates to the various activities in a business enterprise would be useful or desirable. Subjects to be discussed include Company Law, Contract, and the Law relating to the employment of persons: law affecting the Sale of Goods, Hire and Purchase, Bills of Exchange and Contracts of Carriage. No previous knowledge of law will be assumed.

173. Practical Aspects of Taxation. J. K. S. Thong, F.A.C.C.A., F.C.I.S. Thursdays, 8.15-9.15 p.m., starting February 15, 1973. Extra Mural Town Centre. 15 meetings. Fee: \$60

The principles of assessing incomes liable to taxation and the problems arising. The various functions of the Departments of the Inland Revenue including the duties and powers of the Assessors, the Board of Inland Revenue and the Board of Review. The practical problems of submitting tax returns, expenses, claims and appealing against tax assessments. It is suitable for business executives as well as those wanting a basic knowledge of how taxes on corporations and individuals are levied and paid.

174. 銀行實務(二)

(Practical Banking II)

175. 投資學(二)

(Investment II)

這科高級投資課程將包括證券的本身基本情形及股市趨勢分析。損益表以及資產負債表將會作深入的研究及分析。並特別注重各種工業股票之市價與盈利比率。個別行業之基本分析,買賣以及劃線表之走勢及技術性之研究。(共十四講)。

176. 投資設廠研究 (Industrial Investment)

費:七十元。

本課程共十三講,主要內容包括投資設廠各問題。例如: 設廠計劃之編製;經營行業與主要產品種類的選擇;產品設計問 題;工藝規程問題 ; 生產規模問題 ; 廠房型式之選擇與廠房設 計;設廠地區,地址之選擇;工廠結構問題;車間組織設計;廠 **址總體設計等。**

177. Starting A New Business Enterprise. William Cheng, B.S. (Caltec), M.B.A. (Harvard). Tuesdays, 6.00-7.30 p.m., starting March 6, 1973. Extra Mural Town Centre. 8 meetings.

This course will survey basic elements and characteristics of entrepreneurship and is designed for people who have embarked on a new business enterprise or are about to start up their own business. Various development stages of the enterprise will be discussed: planning, preparation, procedures for establishment, managerial and administrative practices and expansion. The emphasis will be placed upon the practical aspects of starting a new business venture and the ways of solving problems which commonly occur in such an undertaking.

Diploma in Management Studies

The Department of Extra-Mural Studies is responsible for this two-year part-time day release University Diploma which is offered to graduates or other suitably experienced and qualified candidates. Those selected will be expected to attend for two evenings per week and to be given release by their employers for one afternoon per week over the two year duration of the course. Applications for the 1973 September intake to the first year of this course should be sent to the Department by no later than June 9, 1973. Economics & Statistics

180. Money and Balances of Payment. M. E. Morkre, B.A. (Redland), Ph.D. (Northwestern), Senior Lecturer in Economics, University of Hong Kong. Tuesdays, 6.15-7.15 p.m., starting February 13, 1973. University Main Building. 20 meetings. Fee: \$100

The course proposes to study, from a relatively non-technical standpoint, the relationship between the operation of an economy's monetary system and its international trade and transfer activities. Emphasis will be placed on the Hong Kong economy and when possible illustrations and examples will be given. A sample of the experiences of other countries, in particular some of Hong Kong's major trading partners will be taken up as well. Candidates will need the equivalent of A-level economics plus either further academic work or relevant business experience.

181. Introduction to Statistics. Ho Fong Hoe, B.A. (H.K.), Demonstrator in Statistics, University of Hong Kong. Wednesdays, 7.00-8.00 p.m., starting February 21, 1973. Extra Mural Town Centre. 10 meetings. Fee: \$50

This course conveys a basic understanding of the elements of statistics and of the range of applications. The object is to establish firmly the bridge between the elementary treatment of a first course in statistics and the rigorous treatment given in more advanced university courses. The key of the course is the learning of the common methods of classifying and representing data.

182. Methods of Operational Research. Ho Fong Hoe, B.A. (H.K.), Demonstrator in Statistics, University of Hong Kong. Tuesdays, 5.30–7.00 p.m., starting March 27, 1973. Extra Mural Town Centre. 16 meetings.

Fee: \$100

This course introduces some important and useful concepts in operational research; it also serves as a stepping stone for further studies in this rapidly growing field. It will deal with linear programming; allocation problems: the assignment and distribution of resources; replacement and maintenance problems; inventory control and production scheduling; network analysis; sequencing problems; and critical path analysis.

Participants in this course are expected to have a basic knowledge of algebra and calculus.

183. Modern Educational Techniques: Topics for Practising Teachers. N. K. Henderson, Ph.D. (London), B.A., M.Ed. (Melb.), A.B.Ps.S., F.C.P., Professor of Education, University of Hong Kong. Thursdays, 6.00-7.30 p.m., starting February 15, 1973. Room 121, University Main Building. 10 meetings. Fee: \$60

This course is in part a refresher course for teachers, and in part an opportunity to introduce to Hong Kong teachers some new thinking in the areas of school administration, teaching procedures and school guidance and counselling methods. Although mainly concerned with secondary schools, the lectures and demonstrations will also have much of interest for upper primary school teachers. The results of recent experiments and research will be studied at some stages, but attention will be mainly given to Hong Kong school needs and local teachers' problems: pupils' problems and promoting better study habits will also be treated. There will be films, full sets of printed notes will be issued, and ample opportunities for questions and discussions will be provided.

184. 低能(智力)兒童的管教 (Understanding and Helping the Mentally Handicapped Child—An Appreciation of the Problem)

本課程之目的爲使社會人仕、家長、及直接爲低能兒童工作之教師、護士、社會工作者、或訓導員,對低能兒童有基本之了解,並在管教方面,有正確之認識。

課程內容包括緒論,社會對低能兒童之照顧,低能兒童之 成因及本質(包括醫療方面),低能兒童之需要,及其在家庭, 學校,社會及職業方面之適應問題,教育問題,職業訓練等等

講授方面以粵語爲主。方式包括專題講座,電影,討論 參觀低能兒童訓練機構等。限收三十名。在職專業者及兒童家 將獲優先取錄。

185. Topics in Sixth Form Chemistry—3. A Mechanistic Approach to Organic Chemistry. Wednesdays, 6.00–7.30 p.m., starting February 14 1973. Chemistry Building, University of Hong Kong. 8 meetings. Fee: \$80

Tutors: Dr. M. J. K. Lie, Lecturer in Chemistry, University of Hong Kong.

Dr. K. F. Cheng, Lecturer in Chemistry, University of Hong Kong.

Mr. R. T. Allsop, Lecturer in Education, University of Hong Kong.

This short course is designed to provide an introduction to the study of organic chemistry via a mechanistic approach. It is designed for teachers of sixth-form chemistry.

The course will attempt to treat two distinct aspects of the topic, firstly from the view point of furthering the personal chemical education of the participants, and secondly from the view point of possible applications of the topic to the sixth-form context. The planned changes in the Hong Kong University Advanced Level Chemistry syllabus will bring this approach to Organic Chemistry within the compass of the sixth-form teacher for the first time.

The course will consist of a series of lectures and tutorials, eight in all. Additionally there will be objective-type questions and simple programmed units to be completed during the course. It has been designed initially for those teachers with little or no background in mechanistic approaches, but the small group tutorials should allow more advanced discussion if there is a demand for it.

Tuition will be aimed at eradicating common errors in English Speech, articulation and intonation and rhythm. The basic causes of the difficulties that are encountered by Cantonese-speaking students will be analysed, methods of correction suggested and graded and aural-oral exercises provided.

The tutor is Principal, Queen's College and formerly Principal, Sir Robert Black College of Education. He is also author of a number of books on Phonetics, including English Pronunciation Explained with Diagrams and English Speech Training.

191. Advanced Oral Communication. Kenneth Method, English Language Teaching Adviser, Longman Group (Far East) Ltd. Mondays and Wednesdays, 6.15-7.45 p.m., starting March 5, 1973. Wah Yan College, Queen's Road East. 10 meetings. Fee: \$70

The tutor will help the students to analyse a selection of fairly typical conversations in relation to frequently recurring situations, and then provide them with related material that they will reproduce in conversations that will take place in class. Particular attention will be paid not only to what is said, but also to how it is said in relation to the western cultural environment. The emphasis will therefore be on the implications of intonation, tone of voice, gesture and facial expression.

This course is intended for those who, although they may have a good passive command of English, feel that they need guidance and further practice in everyday conversations with westerners. It is not therefore intended for those whose spoken English is weak or who are looking for a basic course in pronunciation. Enrolment is limited to those who are best qualified to benefit from the course and participate in it, and the final selection may be by interview.

SPOKEN ENGLISH

In all these courses modern language laboratory teaching methods will be used to give the maximum opportunity for speaking English. The tuition in Spoken English I will be aimed at improving the students' pronunciation and intonation and giving them plenty of opportunity in asking and answering oral questions. In Spoken English II the emphasis will be on conversational English in different situations.

The tutors for all these courses will be drawn from a panel of university graduates.

In order to allow the tutors to pay the maximum amount of attention to individual students, enrolment is limited to 15 persons in each course and may be by selection of those best qualified to benefit from the courses. Preference will be given to applicants attending a Use of English course or those who have completed one.

All the courses will be held in the language laboratory of the Language Centre at Hong Kong University.

In both courses the teaching will be directly related to the translation needs of Hong Kong, and in the second course considerable attention will be paid to the translation of technical and legal terms.

On completion of the first course students may sit a test which, if they pass satisfactorily, will qualify them to proceed to the second course. Those who complete both courses consecutively may apply for a Certificate of Attendance. As these two courses together comprise a continuous programme, applicants for English in Translation II will not normally be accepted unless they have previously completed English in Translation I satisfactorily.

The tutor, who has had considerable experience of teaching translation methods in Hong Kong, Singapore and Taiwan, was previously employed by International Agencies of the United Nations as a translator.

The aim is to provide teachers with more teaching material for classroom use. Mathematical topics as well as other background material will be discussed.

220. Certificate Course in Medical Laboratory Technology (ordinary level).

A two-year Certificate Course in Medical Laboratory Technology designed to provide a broad based science education in biochemistry, biology, mathematics and medical laboratory science for technicians-intraining already working in medical laboratories.

The course will commence in February and will take place on two or three evenings a week at the University of Hong Kong.

222. The Changing Role and Status of Women in China Through Literature. Miss Shelley Wong, B.A. (Calif.). Wednesdays, 7.00-8.30 p.m., starting February 14, 1973. Hong Kong Christian Council, Metropole Building, 5th floor, 57 Peking Road, Kowloon. 12 meetings. Fee: \$60

This course will compare depictions of women in literature from three different periods: Ancient, Republican, and Communist China. Discussion will include such topics as: Changes in the family system and women's role and status, the rise and development of the women's movement, and Communist policies toward women today.

Works selected will include excerpts from: Book of Poetry, Dream of the Red Chamber, Selected Stories of Lu Hsun, Pa Chin's The Family, Han Suyin's autobiographical trilogy, Madame Sun's selected works, the current model plays such as The Red Lantern, and short stories from China today. Reference will be made to the tutor's observations during her recent tour of China of the current role and status of women.

223. Continuity and Change in Japanese Society. Mrs. Stephenie Levin, B.A. (Ohio), M.A. (Ill.). Thursdays, 6.15-7.45 p.m., starting February 15, 1973. University Main Building. 10 meetings. Fee: \$60

In this course, the idea will be developed that pre-industrial social institutions are not necessarily incompatible with the requirements of industrialising societies. This idea will be illustrated with particular reference to the Japanese family and kinship system, showing how this system provided employers with a mobile and highly motivated work force and how the ideal model of the family system was utilised by employers as a basis for organising behaviour in industrial organisations.


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
