



SPECIAL COURSES

The Department welcomes enquiries and requests from business organizations, government, voluntary bodies or private institutions for specially designed courses to meet their specific education needs.

PRIOR ENROLMENT IS ESSENTIAL

Failure to enrol prior to the opening of a particular course may mean the cancellation of that course. Prior enrolment is the only way the Department of Extra-Mural Studies has of judging the response to its courses. Your co-operation is therefore invited in sending your application forms to the Department as soon as possible.

GENERAL INFORMATION

- r. There are normally no entry requirements except that applicants should be over 18 years of age. Occasionally to have the full benefit of a course applicants must possess certain defined qualifications. Applicants are therefore advised to read the description of a course carefully. Professional courses usually have clearly defined entry requirements.
- 2. The Director may at his discretion refuse to admit an applicant.
- 3. Unless otherwise arranged, no Extra-Mural lectures will be held:

(a) on any public holidays.

- (b) at a storm warning signal of No. 8 or above. (After the typhoon passes, if the No. 8 signal is lowered before 3 p.m., classes will take place as normal. If the signal is lowered after 3 p.m., classes will be cancelled that evening.)
- (c) during the following holiday period: January 21–26, 1974 inclusive (Lunar New Year).
- 4. Fees are not refundable once the course has commenced.
- 5. Certificates of Attendance are issued, on payment of 50 cents, to those who have attended not less than two-thirds of a course of at least 20 meetings in duration.
- **6.** Closing date for enrolment: one week before the starting date of a course. Late enrolments may not be accepted.

APPRECIATION

174. Modern Art Movements Since 1900. Paul Reader, Dip.A.D. (Leeds.). Tuesdays, 11.00 a.m.—12.30 p.m., starting February 5, 1974. Extra-Mural Town Centre. 15 meetings. Fee \$100

This course introduces all the significant developments of modern art. It opens with an introduction a little before 1900, and continues through to the present day. The course specifically concentrates on Post-War American painting, and illuminates the development of modern art in its historical context.

Enrolment is limited to 30 persons.

175. Furniture & Interior Design. Gary Salter, B.A. (Oklahoma), B.A. Tulsa (Art History), Dip.Ed. (Georgia). Tuesdays, 2.30-4.30 p.m., lecture 2.30-4.00 p.m., discussion 4.00-4.30 p.m., starting February 5, 1974. Extra-Mural Town Centre. 10 meetings. Fee: \$100

After a general survey of the development of the forms of furniture and furnishings from Egyptian times to early modern, this course will concentrate on problems of living today, and in particular, problems of Hong Kong domestic interior design. Discussion of the furniture itself and its deployment, together with problems of scale, use of colours, will be analysed against our own background.

Enrolment is limited to 30 persons.

176. Book Production and Design. Savio Au, Fridays, 7.00-9.00 p.m., starting February 8, 1974. Extra-Mural Town Centre. 12 meetings. Fee: \$90

This is a basic course for beginners as well as a supplementary course for those already in the business: publishers, printers, graphic designers and artists; or students in commercial art and design. The course will provide information on every aspect of book design and production; not only with arrangement of type or text, and jacket design, but with editorial work, illustration, estimating, printing machinery and technique, as well as a choice of a printer or compositor.

The course includes trips to printers, publishers and a design studio. Enrolment is limited to 30 persons.

PRACTICAL PRINTMAKING; DRAWING; AND PAINTING

These are practical classes in the visual arts with emphasis on imaginative painting or drawing, designed to encourage growth of individual creative powers. Work will be carried out in the various media described.

Enrolment is open to students at different stages, beginners being particularly welcome.

Materials will be discussed at the initial meeting in each class and students must provide all materials necessary or buy the same through the department.

In cases where a model is used an additional fee will be charged.

177. Practical Design Course. Paul Reader, Dip.A.D. (Leeds). Wednesdays, 2.00-4.00 p.m., starting February 6, 1974. Extra-Mural Town Centre. 20 meetings. Fee: \$170

This course introduces fundamental ideas of 2 and 3 dimensional design through practical work. It results in the student producing simple constructions and models for domestic application. Efforts will be made to develop each student's personal approach to design, so that their ideas may be applied to their individual work, and to domestic needs.

Enrolment is limited to 25 persons.

178. 3D Design in Various Media. Miss Martha Lesser, B.S. (N.Y.U.). Thursdays, 2.00-4.30 p.m., starting February 7, 1974. Extra-Mural Town Centre. 15 meetings. Fee: \$150

Through the use of simple materials—wire, cardboard, styrefoam, papier-mâché, string etc—students will explore the basic principles of 3 dimensional design and its application to everyday life. Students will be expected to provide their own materials.

Enrolment is limited to 20 persons.

179. Portraiture in Various Media. Miss Martha Lesser, B.S. (N.Y.U.). Fridays, 10.00 a.m.—12.30 p.m., starting February 8, 1974. Extra-Mural Town Centre. 15 meetings. Fee: \$150

Using the human head as "take off point" subject, students explore 2 and 3 dimensional media such as charcoal, pencil, poster paint, papier mâché, wire etc.

Students will be expected to provide their own materials and an additional fee of \$25 will be charged to cover the cost of models.

Enrolment is limited to 17 persons.

180. Printmaking and Experimental Fabric Design. Mrs. Diane Jones-Parry, Dip. A.D. (Camberwell), A.T.C. (Hornsey). Fridays, 10.00 a.m.—12.30 p.m., starting February 8, 1974. Pokfulam Studio, 144 Pokfulam Road. 12 meetings. Fee: \$120 plus \$25 materials fee

During the course students will explore the potentials of pattern and print-making; surface printing, wood and lino block and silk screen. They will then experiment with fabric painting and printing, using direct methods as well as printing methods. The emphasis will be on "experimental" as students will be working in the classroom and not laboratory conditions. Beginners welcome. Students will be expected to provide all materials. An additional charge of 25 dollars per head will be made to cover the cost of inks and other sundries.

Enrolment is limited to 15 persons.

181. 木版水印

182. Advanced Commodity Futures Trading. Neil Carr, M.A., and invited specialists. Mondays and Thursdays, 8.15-9.15 p.m., starting February 4, 1974. Extra-Mural Town Centre. 24 meetings. Fee: \$150

Economics is a subject studying the scarcity of both natural and human resources and the allocation of these resources among people in their respective capacities as consumers, producers and central authorities and the collective behaviour of these groups at the economic institution called the market.

In the spot market (otherwise known as the cash market), all commodities are normally for immediate delivery. The specific quantity, grade and delivery date for each sales are usually determined by the individual buyer and seller.

A futures market is where commodities which have not been produced are bought and sold. It is an alternate market for both buyers and sellers and provides them with protection against unfavourable price changes which may occur in the spot market. The quantity, grade and delivery date for the commodities are standardized.

A futures market is not a substitute for the spot market. It reduces the risk of spot commitment through the medium of hedging and permits spot trading to increase in a larger volume.

The traditional function of a market is to provide the facilities of exchange for a well-defined commodity.

Speculation is a very risky business, so a commodity speculator should approach futures trading as a business venture and apply sound business judgement and necessary techniques. He must analyse his own financial position to determine how much capital may be allocated for such speculative activity, then to try to select a commodity presenting the safest and yet largest potential profit. A qualified speculator should possess at least a basic knowledge of trading fundamentals and adequate information about the particular commodity.

Consideration will be given to the economic aspects of Commodity Futures trading, from the viewpoint of the development of the Market.

61. 工廠管理問題

(Factory Management Problems)

主 講 人:王文敦碩士。

講授語言:粤語(學員自備參考書)。

學 費:四十五元。

本課程共八講,主要內容包括:工廠管理之理論,如管理之基本原則與管理之組織形式,工廠管理之實務,如生產管理,原材料供應與產品銷售管理,技術管理(包括發展新產品,質量控制及設備維修),人事管理,工作研究,及成本管理等。

本課程適合工廠各級管理人員及其他有興趣人士選讀,能助改善經營,促進業務發展。

184. Leadership and Motivation. Gordon Redding, M.A., Ph.D. Thursdays, 7.30-8.30 p.m., starting February 7, 1974. Knowles Building, University of Hong Kong. 6 meetings. Fee: \$40

This specialized course is intended for the personnel executive and those concerned with management training and development. It surveys the development of management theory and concentrates on the latest research in the field of motivation. The problems of management control in the human area of business are discussed as well as the problems of applying Anglo-Saxon theory in an Asian context.

185. Management Decision-Making: A Case Study Approach. Vincent Ng, B.S., M.B.A., M.S. Tuesdays, 8.15-9.15 p.m., starting February 5, 1974. Extra-Mural Town Centre. 7 meetings. Fee: \$40

The course is designed for practising Managers and students of Management Studies who wish to assess and improve their skills in decision-making by means of the Case Study method. A number of Management Cases have been selected, covering the fields of business expansion, marketing, credit lending, cash forecasting and decisions to make or buy. These cases will form the basis of the course, which in turn will require a high degree of participation from those attending. Formal teaching of the principles of decision-making will be kept to a minimum, as the group of participants will be expected to formulate their own ideas from the case material.

53. Consumer Protection and the Law. Raymond Faulkner, B.A. (Cantab.), Barrister-at-Law, Lecturer in Law, University of Hong Kong. Mondays, 6.30-8.00 p.m., starting January 28, 1974. University Main Building. 6 meetings. Fee: \$30

The problem for the non-lawyer is not so much the question of solving legal problems because he can go to a professional for that. It is more a question of knowing that his injury, physical or financial, is one for which the law will give redress. This short series of lectures is designed to point out some areas where the law protects the consumer, perhaps without the consumer's knowledge. It will cover contract, sale of goods, hire purchase and the law of negligence. No previous knowledge of the law will be assumed.

58. 銀行實務(二)

(Practical Banking II)

本課程共十二講,繼續講述銀行實務,特別注意進出口押 滙及跟單商業信用證。關於香港新銀行條例,中央銀行及其他重 要問題,亦加以研討。

186. Principles of Marketing. Gordon Redding, M.A., Ph.D. Mondays, 4.00-5.00 p.m., starting February 4, 1974. Extra-Mural Town Centre. 6 meetings. Fee: \$40

The course aims to give the businessman a set of concepts with which to think out his marketing problems, and to introduce non-marketing executives to the jargon of the trade. The course begins with a general view of company strategy and the role of marketing and then discusses distribution channels, the product life cycle, diffusion of innovations, the marketing mix, pricing, market segmentation, product differentiation and market research. Constant reference will be made to practical examples.

187. Auditing. Charles M. C. Lo, A.C.C.A., A.I.B.A., Wednesdays, 5.45-6.45 p.m., starting February 6, 1974. Extra-Mural Town Centre. 20 meetings. Fee: \$80

The latest auditing methods as well as established practice will be discussed in this course, and legislation affecting auditors is covered fully up-to-date.

While the course covers the subject to final examination level of the accountancy bodies, no previous knowledge of auditing is assumed, and it should therefore prove of assistance to both intermediate and final students.

188. Practical Taxation. David Chau, A.C.I.S. Mondays, 5.45-6.45 p.m., starting February 4, 1974. Extra-Mural Town Centre. 15 meetings. Fee: \$50

The principles and practice of Hong Kong Income Tax Law. Topics include discussion of property tax, salaries tax, profits tax, personal assessment and related problems. Decisions of court cases and the practical aspects of submitting tax returns and appealing against tax assessments will also be discussed.

189. The Structure of Commerce. Liang Chu-chang, B.Sc., M.B.A., Ph.D. Mondays, 7.30-8.30 p.m., starting February 4, 1974. Knowles Building, University of Hong Kong. 9 meetings. Fee: \$45

Subjects to be discussed in this course include the nature and scope of commercial activity; the main commercial functions, including exchange, transport and storage finance, risk-bearing; supply and demand, and their effect on price under conditions of competition and monopoly; money, bills of exchange, methods of payment and foreign exchange; the balance of payments and International Trade; banks and their main services; business ownership, control, the provision of capital, its use and the relationship of capital, stock, turnover, expenses and profit.

215. 商業機構

(Structure of Commerce)

課程內容包括商業之性質及商業活動之範圍;商業之主要任務,包括交易、運輸、倉庫、財務、保障風險;供求對物價在自由競爭及專利等情形下對物價之影響;貨幣、匯票及其他付欵方法,如外匯、國際收支平衡與國際貿易;銀行及業務;商業組織及管理;資本之來源;資本之功用及關係;股票週轉、費用及純利(共九講)。

190. A Refresher Course Highlighting Recent Developments in School Counselling, Educational Administration and Modern Classroom Management. N. K. Henderson, Ph.D. (London), B.A., M.Ed. (Melb.), A.B.Ps.S., F.C.P., Professor of Education, University of Hong Kong. Thursdays, 6.00-7.30 p.m., starting February 7, 1974. Room 121, University Main Building. 12 meetings. Fee: \$70

As this will be the last Extra-Mural course offered in Hong Kong by Professor Henderson, he has agreed to make this refresher course of 12 lectures cover a wide range of topics and bring together for practising teachers the main modern trends in counselling, administration and psychology in the classroom.

Full notes as well as sample tests, data-sheets etc. will be issued at every session. There will be ample time for questions and discussion. Some case-studies in school administration problems typical of Hong Kong and in pupil progress and behaviour difficulties will be analysed.

The course will include topics of interest and value to local teachers in the areas of educational psychology and counselling, school organization and classroom management.

rg3. Introduction to Petroleum Technology. P. I. F. Niem, B.Sc. Tech., Ph.D. (Manc.), A.M.C.T., C.Eng. M.I.Chem.E., F.Inst. Pet., Lecturer in Industrial Engineering, H.K.U.; P. F. Y. Wong, B.Sc., Ph.D. (Birm.), C.Eng., M.I.Chem.E., A.M.Inst.F., Lecturer in Mechanical Engineering, H.K.U. Tuesdays, 6.15–8.30 p.m., starting February 5, 1974. Knowles Building, University of Hong Kong. 10 meetings. Fee: \$100

This course is designed for school teachers and engineers in industry and commerce. It aims to provide up-to-date knowledge of the science and technology of petroleum and its derivatives.

The following topics will be covered: origin of oil and its classification; physical chemistry of hydro-carbons; manufacturing processes and the oil refinery; standard methods for testing of petroleum products; linear programming of product blending and market simulation; petroleum chemicals including plastics.

UNIVERSITY ENTRANCE

The attention of extra-mural students is drawn to the following regulation of the University of Hong Kong regarding admission to the University:

'A mature person without formal academic qualifications who is aged 30 or over on September 1 of the year in which admission is sought may be exempted completely from University entrance requirements but shall not be eligible for admission to the Faculty of Medicine.'

194. Reading and Discussion. H. F. Price, B.A. (Simon Fraser). Fridays, 6.15-7.45 p.m., starting February 1, 1974. Wah Yan College, Queen's Road East. 10 meetings. Fee: \$50

This further course, which is intended for those who have a good command of English and which is particularly suitable for teachers and journalists, is aimed at providing ample opportunity to consider different kinds and styles of writing in English. In addition to the textbook mentioned below, a number of examples of different kinds of non-literary prose will be made available during the course for critical examination and discussion in class. The tutor will lead the discussions and explain how the writers achieved a certain effect by the way in which they wrote. Minimum qualification for enrolment: a Pass in English at G.C.E. "Ordinary" level or equivalent. Enrolment will be limited to 25 persons and may be by selection. Suitably qualified applicants are advised to apply for enrolment in Course 195, "Style in Writing", as well.

This course is a study of geographic thought and research methods on geographic problems. The rest of the course introduces some of the basic quantitative approaches which have been employed by human geographers to solve problems. Included in the few case studies which illustrate the scope of research procedures in geography, is a lecture on mental maps of Hong Kong households and their construction.

To understand Modern China, it is essential to have some knowledge of Ancient China, which, in itself, is a fascinating study. To this end, the following topics have been selected for discussion: the cradle of Chinese civilisation; geographic influences on Chinese history and culture; trends in Chinese history, particularly the dynastic cycle; ways of Chinese thinking; the Chinese mode of life and social structure; political concepts; the Chinese as an artistic nation; early Chinese contacts with the outside world.

Little or no previous knowledge of Chinese History will be assumed.

212. Buddhist Art in China. Chuang Shen, B.A. (Taiwan), M.A. (Prin.), Lecturer in Chinese, University of Hong Kong. Thursdays, 6.00–7.30 p.m., starting February 7, 1974. Extra-Mural Town Centre. 15 meetings. Fee: \$65

This illustrated course will provide an introduction to the Buddhist art of China. The course will deal with the following three aspects: Buddhist architecture, sculpture and painting. The newly discovered archaeological material of Chinese monumental works will be used to illustrate the artistic transmission of Buddhist art from India via Central Asia and finally to China.

The course will commence with a study of rock-cut caves in China followed by a survey of Buddhist temples and pagodas. It will also deal with the mythology and iconography of Buddhism; Buddhist sculptures; Buddhist wall paintings and their influence on Chinese secular art. The course will conclude with a survey of the influence of Zen Buddhism on Chinese painting and the spread of Zen Buddhism to Japan.

213. An Introduction to the Hindu and Buddhist Art of India. Mrs. Rajeshwari Ghose, B.A. Hons. (Calcutta), M.A. (H.K.). Fridays, 2.30-4.00 p.m., starting February 8, 1974. Extra-Mural Town Centre. 18 meetings. Fee: \$80

This illustrated course will provide an introduction to the Hindu & Buddhist art of India. It will commence with a survey of the development of both religions and discuss their beliefs, mythology and iconography. It will examine at length the development of secular and religious architecture in India—the Hindu rock-cut temples, the Buddhist cave monasteries, the Hindu temple in south India and its development as a temple-town. It will also deal with the different Schools of Indian Sculpture—the classical and romantic trends, the erotic sculptures of north and east India, bronze casting, terracottas, ivory carving and the fascinating murals and fresco paintings of Ajanta.

The course will conclude with a very brief glimpse of the spread of these art forms and concepts in Nepal, Tibet and Southeast Asia.

216. Plant Ecology. Tuesdays, 6.15–8.15 p.m., starting January 29, 1974. Knowles Building, Room 722, University of Hong Kong. 10 meetings, followed by a field weekend at the Wu Kwai Sha Youth Village on April 6th and 7th.

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
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GROUND PLAN OF UNIVERSITY OF HONG KONG MAIN BUILDING
