

GENERAL INFORMATION

- 1. There are normally no entry requirements except that applicants should be over 18 years of age. Occasionally to have the full benefit of a course applicants must possess certain defined qualifications. Applicants are therefore advised to read the description of a course carefully. Professional courses usually have clearly defined entry requirements.
- 2. The Director may at his discretion refuse to admit an applicant.
- 3. Unless otherwise arranged, no Extra-Mural lectures will be held:

(a) on any public holidays.

- (b) at a storm warning signal of No. 8 or above. (After the typhoon passes, if the No. 8 signal is lowered before 3 p.m., classes will take place as normal. If the signal is lowered after 3 p.m., classes will be cancelled that evening.)
- 4. Fee are not refundable once the course has commenced.
- 5. Certificates of Attendance are issued, on payment of 50 cents, to those who have attended not less than two-thirds of a course of at least 20 meetings in duration.
- 6. Closing date for enrolment: one week before the starting date of a course. Late enrolments may not be accepted.
- 7. For enquiries, please ring either 5-468161, Ext. 307 or 306 or 308, or 5-450021 (3 lines), during office hours.

HOW TO ENROL

- 8. Complete the attached enrolment form and mail it to the Director, Department of Extra-Mural Studies, University of Hong Kong. Forms are also available on request. To ensure that a class can take place, the Department would appreciate early enrolment by applicants.
- 9. You should send your application form together with the appropriate fee either in the form of a postal order, money order or crossed cheque made out in favour of the UNIVERSITY OF HONG KONG.
- 10. You will be notified if you are not admitted because of oversubscription or other reasons. THE DEPARTMENT WILL NOT NOTIFY SUCCESSFUL APPLICANTS WHO ARE EXPECTED TO ATTEND THE FIRST MEETING OF THE CLASS AT THE PLACE AND TIME ADVERTISED.

Courses in Art & Design and related areas are open to students of all levels of development unless otherwise stated.

PRACTICAL STUDIO COURSES IN ART & DESIGN

These are practical studio classes in the Visual Arts with emphasis on artistic skills and creative growth of the individual. Work will be carried out in the various media described.

Students must provide all necessary materials, some of which will be available for purchase through the department. Materials will be discussed at the first class meeting.

311. Silkscreen and Serigraphic Printing. Jacqueline Sutliff, B.A. (University of Minnesota). Mondays, 6.30–8.30 p.m., starting February 13, 1978. Pokfulam Studio, 144 Pokfulam Road. 12 meetings. Fee: \$185

The silkscreen and serigraph have developed from the simple stencil, and screenprinting is among the youngest of the printmaking crafts. As such it is in an exciting state of expansion with the uses of varied techniques ranging from decorative elements to fine art prints. The aim of this course is to present the silkscreen and serigraphic medium to the student, to allow him to explore its potential and versatility, and to produce prints in both black and white, and colour.

Students will be expected to provide many of their own materials. Inks and sundries for use during class sessions will be provided, and the cost of these is included in the course fee.

Enrolment is limited to 17 persons.

PRIOR ENROLMENT IS ESSENTIAL

Failure to enrol prior to the opening of a particular course may mean the cancellation of that course. Prior enrolment is the only way the Department of Extra-Mural Studies has of judging the response to its courses. Your co-operation is therefore invited in sending your application forms to the Department as soon as possible.

312. Traditional Watercolour Painting. Clifford L. Catlin, B.F.A. (University of Arizona, Tucson). Mondays, 8.00-10.00 p.m., starting February 13, 1978. Extra-Mural Town Centre, Wing On Centre, 8th Floor, Hong Kong. 12 meetings. Fee: \$140

Unlike the spontaneity of experimental watercolour painting, the traditional style deals with a preconceived image which is generally conveyed in a realistic and figurative manner. Due however to the fluid nature of watercolour many changes in the work are apt to occur in the course of painting: the results often being delightful and surprising. Early in the course still life will be the main subject, and later land and seascapes, the figure, and portraiture will be approached. In addition to painting, class time will be spent on discussions and critiques.

There will be weekly assignments, and students should be prepared to spend four to six hours on these. Previous drawing experience is advisable, though not mandatory.

313. Experimental Watercolour Painting. Jacqueline Sutliff, B.A. (University of Minnesota). Tuesdays, 8.00–10.00 p.m., starting February 14, 1978. Extra-Mural Town Centre, Wing On Centre, 8th Floor, Hong Kong. 12 meetings. Fee: \$140

Watercolour painting is one of the few techniques that can be used in unstructured, spontaneous, and unfamiliar ways, thus enabling the student to achieve an endless variety of effects. In this course students will experiment with various combinations of water based media including traditional watercolour, dyes, inks, and polymer media as applied to papers, canvas, and parchment in an attempt to discover some of the possibilities and their applications.

This course is suitable for both beginners and more advanced students.

314. Modelling in Clay from Life and Still-Life. Karen McKeon, D.A. (Edin.). Tuesdays, 6.30–8.30 p.m., starting February 14, 1978. Pokfulam Studio, 144 Pokfulam Road. 12 meetings.

Fee: \$195 including model and material fees

As modelling is a form of three-dimensional drawing it represents less of a physical transformation than its graphic counterpart. Using clay as the basic material, students will deal with space and mass in order to develop their perception, and to discover some basic "structure-shape" characteristics of various objects. With this knowledge, students can then go on to re-shape subject matter in a sculptural way.

The cost of materials for use during the class sessions is included in the fee. Students will, however, be expected to provide their own tools.

315. Introduction to Graphic Design. Redge Solley, N.D.D. Tuesdays, 8.00–10.00 p.m., starting February 14, 1978. Extra-Mural Town Centre, Wing On Centre, 8th Floor, Hong Kong. 12 meetings. Fee: \$140

The principles of two dimensional design will be discussed in relation to graphic design. Following this, the basic graphic design elements of typography, symbols, and photography, will be used in various projects such as posters, logos, and television graphics, to create simple, but effective, graphic designs. In addition students will study and discuss examples of contemporary graphic design in order to discover what good graphic communication involves. There will also be a visit to an advertising agency to see at first hand how graphic projects are developed in a professional environment.

Students should note that there will homework assignments and should plan their time accordingly.

316. Interior Decoration. Douglas Cooper, B.A. (Kingston Polytechnic). Wednesdays, 6.00-8.00 p.m., starting February 15, 1978. Extra-Mural Town Centre, Wing On Centre, 8th Floor, Hong Kong. 12 meetings. Fee: \$140

Intended as a basic introduction to the skill of interior decoration, this course will cover: choice of materials for use in interiors, the uses of plan and elevation drawings, colour theory and lighting. Students will be given assignments in order to stimulate an imaginative approach to problem solving.

In order to gain full benefit from this course students should plan on spending four to six hours per week on homework assignments.

317. Interior Design Concepts. Douglas Cooper, B.A. (Kingston Polytechnic). Wednesdays, 8.00-10.00 p.m., starting February 15, 1978. Extra-Mural Town Centre, Wing On Centre, 8th Floor, Hong Kong. 12 meetings. Fee: \$140

Students will be given a series of assignments and projects in which the emphasis will be placed upon space planning and its relationship to concepts of Interior Design. A high level of student participation is expected and only those willing to produce work outside the studio sessions should apply.

318. Painting in Acrylic and Mixed Media. Nancy Woo, M.F.A. (Cornell), M.A. (Columbia). Wednesdays, 6.00-8.00 p.m., starting February 15, 1978. Extra-Mural Town Centre, Wing On Centre, 8th Floor, Hong Kong. 12 meetings. Fee: \$140

Acrylic polymer paints offer exciting possibilities not available with traditional painting media. Being both water based and permanent they can be used in a range from wet-on-wet to impasto, and their highly adhesive nature makes them most suitable for work in collage. This course will venture into acrylic based mixed media, exploring not only the fundamentals, but also moving towards the exciting challenge of more ambitious paintings.

This course is suitable for both beginners and more advanced students.

319. Landscape Workshop. Robert O'Brien, Dip.A.D. Wednesdays, 6.30-8.30 p.m., starting February 15, 1978. Pokfulam Studio, 144 Pokfulam Road. 12 meetings. Fee: \$140

Paul Klee said, "For the artist, communication with nature remains the most essential condition." The emphasis in this course will be on learning to see and to feel. The principles of painting and drawing will be discussed in relation to landscape and the workshop will use a variety of media. Students will be expected to produce studies done outside the sessions, and if dates can be agreed there will be field trips to various sites.

320. Life Drawing. K. Burns McKeon, D.A. (Edin.). Thursdays, 6.00-8.00 p.m., starting February 16, 1978. Extra-Mural Town Centre, Wing On Centre, 8th Floor, Hong Kong. 12 meetings.

Fee: \$190 including model fee

Drawing from the human figure and nature provides a discipline which develops visual perception and correlation of hand and eye. Regular practice, even by the most experienced artist, is essential to sustain ability. This course will include anatomy, life drawing, draped figure, and head studies. A variety of media will be used including pencil, conte crayon, and ink. Both beginners and more advanced students are welcome.

321. Woodblock and Mixed-Media Printmaking. Nancy Woo, M.F.A. (Cornell), M.A. (Columbia). Thursdays, 6.30-8.30 p.m., starting February 16, 1978. Pokfulam Studio, 144 Pokfulam Road. 12 meetings. Fee: \$185

A chief merit of prints is their ability to meet the human mind on a simple level of appreciation and to lure it on to a more complex level of enjoyment as one's comprehension increases. This course will give the student an introduction to those basic techniques of woodblock printmaking and mixed-media printing, which will enable the student to carry on in the media beyond the level which can be attained in twelve meetings. Both monochrome, and multi-colour prints will be produced, and class critiques will be held on these. In addition there will be discussions on both traditional and contemporary Western and Japanese woodblock prints.

Students will be expected to provide most drawing and cutting materials. Some inks and sundries will be provided, and the cost of these is included in the course fee.

322. Painting in Oil, Acrylic, and Related Media. Martha Lesser, B.S. (N.Y.U.). Mondays, 10.00 a.m.—12.00 noon, starting February 13, 1978. Extra-Mural Town Centre, Wing On Centre, 8th Floor, Hong Kong. 12 meetings. Fee: \$155 including model fee

The idea of making a painting is a very exciting one to many people. Even more exciting is what one achieves after work in the media and study of the subject. As painting is an ongoing activity both beginners and advanced students are welcome, but it should be pointed out that some experience of drawing is essential. For beginners the basic questions of what materials to use, composition, and use of colour, will be discussed. More advanced students will receive guidance in how to more successfully achieve their aims, and, more basically, how to set their aims.

323. Experimental Watercolour Painting. Jacqueline Sutiff, B.A. (University of Minnesota). Tuesdays, 10.00 a.m.-12.00 noon, starting February 14, 1978. Extra-Mural Town Centre, Wing On Centre, 8th Floor, Hong Kong. 12 meetings. Fee: \$140

324. Life Drawing. K. Burns McKeon, D.A. (Edin.). Thursdays, 10.00 a.m.—12.00 noon, starting February 16, 1978. Extra-Mural Town Centre, Wing On Centre, 8th Floor, Hong Kong. 12 meetings.

Fee: \$190 including model fee

325. A Guide to Photography. Andrew Mitchell. Thursdays, 8.00–10.00 p.m., starting February 16 and March 30, 1978. Extra-Mural Town Centre, Wing On Centre, 8th Floor, Hong Kong. 5 meetings. Fee: \$65

Not everyone wants to be a photographer, but most people like to take pictures. This course will help the amateur to take better pictures. Types of cameras, lenses, films, and accessories will be discussed, as will the basics of composition, lighting, and selective focussing. If time permits there will also be an introduction to the developing and printing of black and white photographs.

326. Photography: an Introduction. Andrew Mitchell. Wednesdays, or Fridays, 7.00–9.00 p.m., starting February 15 & 17, 1978. Extra-Mural Town Centre, Wing On Centre, 8th Floor, Hong Kong. 12 meetings.

Fee: \$170

Aimed at those with a serious interest in photography as a vehicle for expression and communication, this course will cover the basic studio and darkroom techniques of black and white, and colour photography as well as choices of equipment and materials. In addition, theories of photography, both aesthetic and philosophic, will be explored. Students must be prepared to experiment in the media, and class critiques will be held on the results of these.

Students must provide their own cameras. Basic darkroom materials and supplies to be used during class sessions will be provided, and the cost of these is included in the course fee.

327. Photography: an Intermediate Course. Philip Tse. Thursdays, 7.00-9.00 p.m., starting February 16, 1978. Extra-Mural Town Centre, Wing On Centre, 8th Floor, Hong Kong. 12 meetings. Fee: \$205

In recent years photography has come to be accepted as a fine art form in its own right. The emphasis in this course will be on 'creativity and aesthetics, and it is designed for those already familiar with the basic technical aspects of photography and photographic equipment. While most of the work will deal with black and white photography, colour processing will be introduced. There will be four class field trips to a variety of sites on Saturday and Sunday afternoons, and class critiques will be held on the results of these as well as of studio and independent work.

Chemicals and papers will be provided for use during class sessions, and the cost of these is included in the fee.

328. Photography as an Aid to the Graphic Designer. Philip Tse. Tuesdays, 7.00-9.00 p.m., starting February 14, 1978. Extra-Mural Town Centre, Wing On Centre, 8th Floor, Hong Kong. 12 meetings. Fee: \$175

Photography, because it achieves optical effects never known before, plays a vital part today in designer's work, and techniques of photographics open up completely new vistas. Tuition will include studio and darkroom procedure within the designer's capabilities, detailing some of the many effects which can be achieved by simple manipulation at the developing and printing stages. Colour work, distortion of straightforward images, special screening effects, photo layout, photo mural, graphic art photography, photo dyeing techniques and advertising photography will be discussed. Emphasis will be on practical darkroom work, and there will be a visit to a printer's darkroom.

This intermediate level course is intended for those with a basic knowledge of darkroom procedure. Papers, chemicals and other materials for use during class time will be supplied, and the cost of these has been included in the course fee.

Enrolment is limited to 15 persons.

329. Photography Workshop. Philip Tse. Mondays, 6.00-8.00 p.m., starting February 13, 1978. Extra-Mural Town Centre, Wing On Centre, 8th Floor, Hong Kong. 12 meetings. Fee: \$190 including materials fee

The development of a perceptive and creative eye is an ongoing process. In this advanced level course students will work on creative aspects of photography as applied to a wide variety of subjects, and by the end of the course are expected to have produced a portfolio of black and white, and colour prints. Six of the class sessions will be in the form of field trips on Saturday afternoons and Sundays. The exact place and date of each will be announced two weeks in advance. Students taking this course should have completed "Photography: an Intermediate Course", or the equivalent, because a sound knowledge of studio and darkroom techniques are essential. The cost of chemicals and papers for use during class sessions is included in the fee.

Closing date for applications is January 30, 1978, and in the event of oversubscription an interview will be required. Enrolment is limited to 15 persons.

330. 基本書道

(Introduction to Chinese Calligraphy)

时 間:一九七八年二月十三日起每星期一下午六時至八時。

(共十二講)。

學 費:一百四十元。

旨在通過對中國歷代書體沿革與諸家風格之認識,使學員了解傳統書 道之基本理法;藉以觸發現代書道之探索與對其發展的興趣。

本課程將著重於書寫之實習。除堂課練習外,學員必須以課外時間做 習作。

331. 素 描

(Monochrome Drawing)

主 講 人:郭倩如女士。

講授語言: 粤語。

地 點:香港大學校外課程部市區中心。(永安大厦八樓)。

時 間:一九七八年二月十三日起每星期一下午六時至八時或八時

至十時。(共十二講)。

學 費:一百四十元。

本課程爲繪圖愛好者而設,强調基礎訓練,使學員認識素描的基本概念,掌握整體的觀察方法及初步明白構圖,明暗,透視,比例,空間感的處理,在寫實的基礎上可依據自己的興趣去發展和變化。課程以寫生爲主。對象包括靜物與人物。(限收二十名)。

332. 速 寫 (Sketch)

主 講 人:郭倩如女士。

講授語言: 學 語。

地 點:香港大學校外課程部市區中心。(永安大厦八樓)。

時 間:一九七八年二月十五日起每星期三下午八時至十時。

(共十二講)。

學 費:一百四十元。

速寫不僅可以成爲獨立的藝術,而且也是畫家創作形象的資料。因此 它是每個繪畫者必修之課。本課程是爲稍有繪畫基礎的愛好者而設。將使學 員認識速寫的基本概念和掌握基本的方法。課程內容以寫生人物爲主。

名額限收二十名。

333. 漫 畫

(Cartoon Workshop)

主 講 人: 榮念曾先生。

鑑授語言: 粤語。

地 點:香港大學校外課程部市區中心。(永安大厦八樓)。

時 間:一九七八年二月十六日起每星期四下午六時至八時。

(共十二講)。

學 曹:一百四十元。

本課程專為從事繪製漫畫及對繪製漫畫有興趣的人仕而設。課程包括 基本繪圖訓練、漫畫設計及漫畫主題研究,並以幻燈片介紹不同類型及主題 的漫畫。

334 基本畫道

(Basic Chinese Painting)

主 講 人:翟仕堯先生。

謹授語言: 粤 語。

地 點:香港大學校外課程部市區中心。(永安大厦八樓)。

時 間:一九七八年二月十七日起每星期五下午六時至八時。

(共十二講)。

學 費:一百四十元。

旨在通過有關中國畫道之知識與基本技法之實習,以啓導學員;或使 學員於有所觸發中,發現自我,而建立創作之基礎。

除畫室課程外,學員必須以課外時間作習作。

名額限收二十名。

335. 水墨畫

(Chinese Ink Painting)

主 講 人:翟仕堯先生。

講授語言: 粤語。

地 點:香港大學校外課程部市區中心。(永安大厦八樓)。

時 間:一九七八年二月十七日起每星期五下午八時至十時。

(共十二講)。

學 曹:一百四十元。

本課程將以中國畫道傳統技法爲基本,加以擴充運用探索現代水墨技法,並以描寫香港景物爲主題。

除畫室課程外,學員必須以課外時間做習作。

名額限收二十名。

ART APPRECIATION

These are lecture and discussion courses open to all students regardless of previous Art History study.

336. Cézanne. Robert O'Brien, Dip.A.D. Mondays, 6.15-7.45 p.m., starting February 13, 1978. Extra-Mural Town Centre, Wing On Centre, 8th Floor, Hong Kong. 10 meetings. Fee: \$90

Traditional Western painting has been involved with creating an illusion of three dimensional space on a two dimensional plane, a problem which Cezanne also set out to solve. He attempted to make painting solid and durable, and to express his ideas on the inner nature of form: in the process he established a new order of visual realities. In order to understand Cezanne's unique contribution to painting, his work will be analyzed in detail beginning with his control of volume and space, and his representations of realism and abstraction. Throughout the course reference will be made to contemporary ideas in literature and science in order to view Cezanne in his proper setting.

337. An Introduction to the Art of South-East Asia. Mrs. Rajeshwari Ghose, B.A. (Calcutta), M.A. (H.K.). Fridays, 5.30-7.00 p.m., starting February 24, 1978. Extra-Mural Town Centre, Wing On Centre, 8th Floor. 12 meetings. Fee: \$75

This illustrated course will provide an introduction to the Hindu and Buddhist art of South-east Asia. It will commence with a general survey of the area, trace the progress of the two religions and study the transformations that they underwent in their adopted lands. It will then proceed to a regional study of Burma, Indonesia, Indochina and Thailand, and will examine at length the art of Burma, Cambodia, Laos, Thailand, Indonesia (including Bali), Borneo and Sumatra.

Courses No. 338 to No. 349 are designed to be of assistance to those preparing for the examinations of the Association of Certified Accountants, the Institute of Cost and Management Accountants and the Institute of Chartered Secretaries and Administrators. The courses are a complement, not a substitute, for correspondence courses. Students should make their own arrangements for sitting the relevant examinations.

338. Financial Accounting I: Foundation Stage. J. D. Lane, M.A., A.C.I.S., A.I.B. Fridays, 6.00-8.00 p.m., starting February 17, 1978. Room 721, Knowles Building, University of Hong Kong. 15 meetings.

Fee: \$130

This course is intended for students who are embarking on the study of accounting and have little or no previous experience of the subject. The intention is, however, that the course will follow the syllabus of the A.C.C.A. Accounting I paper, in preparation for the 1978 examinations.

The main topics covered are as follows: the principles involved in the keeping of records of financial transactions, the trial balance and the final accounts of sole traders and partnerships, capital and revenue expenditure, elements of depreciation, accruals and prepayments, the accounts of non-trading institutions, manufacturing accounts, departmental accounts and an introduction to the accounts of companies. In addition, topical aspects in relation to Accounting will be discussed.

339. Intermediate Accounting. Warren Lowe, Dip. Tech. (Comm.), A.A.S.A., A.H.K.S.A. Tuesdays, 6.15-7.45 p.m., starting February 21, 1978. Room 103, University Main Building. 15 meetings. Fee: \$100

Partnership accounts, including change of partners and conversion to limited companies, and company accounts, including the issue of shares and debentures, are amongst subjects which will be covered in this course set at the intermediate level. Designed for students who have a good working knowledge of basic accounting principles, the course will also deal with final accounts for publication, the treatment of taxation in company accounts and the interpretation of accounts, including flow of funds statements.

340. Advanced Financial Accounting. Mrs. S. Panchapakesan, B.Sc., A.C.A. Tuesdays, 6.00–8.00 p.m., starting February 21, 1978. Room 167, University Main Building. 15 meetings. Fee: \$130

The tutor will select topics from the ACA syllabus for Accounting 4. This syllabus covers group accounts, principles of consolidation, theory in relation to the nature and measurement of business income, aspects of financial statement construction and presentation and the interpretation of accounts, accounting treatment of reorganisation and amalgamations and accounting for price level changes. These topics will be treated at the highest level.

341. Economics and the Business Environment. Lui Wing Ku, B.Com., A.I.A.A., A.A.S.A., A.C.S.A., A.H.K.S.A. Fridays, 5.45-7.15 p.m., starting February 17, 1978. Room 20, Extra-Mural Town Centre, Wing On Centre, 8th Floor, Hong Kong. 15 meetings. Fee: \$120

Price theory; demand and supply, elasticity; production theory; distribution theory and factor pricing are some of the economic theories to be considered in this course. The class will also consider microeconomic issues such as ownership and control, monopolies and mergers as well as national income and national product, and macroeconomic issues such as monetary and fiscal stabilisation policy, taxation incomes policy and economic growth. This course is based on the syllabus of the Association of Certified Accountants.

342. Data Processing and Systems Design. Paul Yan, F.I.D.P., F.L.M.I., A.M.B.I.M. Fridays, 8.15-9.30 p.m., starting February 17, 1978. Room 30, Extra-Mural Town Centre, Wing On Centre, 8th Floor, Hong Kong. 15 meetings. Fee: \$100

Students will be introduced to the various parts of a computer system with emphasis on data storage and transmission equipment; the principles of data collecting, recording, storing and processing; systems analysis and design including the charting of systems, and also the development and carrying out of feasibility studies. Relevant cases studies and examples will be introduced and students will be expected to work through examination questions.

343. Statistics for Accountants. K. G. Jones, B.Com. (Melbourne), F.C.C.A., F.H.K.S.A., F.A.S.A., A.C.I.S., Principal Lecturer, Hong Kong Polytechnic. Mondays, 6.15–7.45 p.m., starting February 20, 1978. Room 722, Knowles Building, University of Hong Kong. 14 meetings.

Fee: \$120

The aim of this course is to give students an understanding of the nature of statistical relationships and how to interpret them as an aid in business planning and control. The course will follow the A.C.A. syllabus and topics to be studied include, the nature of statistics, sources, interpretation and collection of data, how to summarise and present data, statistical inference, introductory probability, sampling, correlation and regression and measurement of change.

344. Costing. Charles Kwok, B.A. (Econ.), B.Sc. (Bus. Admin.). Tuesdays, 6.15-7.45 p.m., starting February 21, 1978. Room 228, Knowles Building, University of Hong Kong. 15 meetings. Fee: \$100

The course will follow the ACCA/ACMA I costing syllabus, the main areas of study being as follows: costing for materials, labour and overheads, job costing and process costing. Breakeven analysis, profit/volume ratio, marginal costing, introduction to standard costing, and variance analysis.

345. U.K. Taxation. Loke Hoi-lam, A.C.A., A.C.I.S., A.H.K.S.A. Thursdays, 6.00–7.30 p.m., starting February 16, 1978. Room 167, University Main Building. 14 meetings. Fee: \$110

The aim of this course is to provide an understanding of the principles of United Kingdom Taxation and their application to problems in the areas of law, income tax schedules, tax deductions, the computation of capital allowances, corporation and capital gains tax.

346. Advanced Auditing. Stephen Lau, C.A., A.H.K.S.A. Tuesdays, 8.00-9.30 p.m., starting February 21, 1978. Extra-Mural Town Centre, Wing On Centre, 8th Floor, Hong Kong. 12 meetings. Fee: \$90

Following the ACA syllabus, topics to be discussed and studied are, the validity of principles in public reporting, types of investigations, forms of audit report and the effectiveness of legislation in protecting interested parties, the effect of computers on audit practice, case law affecting auditors, the organisation of an audit and current developments in the practice of auditing.

347. Insolvency, Executorship and Trusteeship. J. M. Morgans, LL.B., B.A. Thursdays, 6.00-7.30 p.m., starting February 16, 1978. Room 30. Extra-Mural Town Centre, Wing On Centre, 8th Floor, Hong Kong. 12 meetings.

This course will follow the syllabus of the A.C.C.A. examination paper of the same name, thus the main areas to be studied will be the law and procedure relating to (a) bankruptcy and deeds of arrangement, (b) voluntary and compulsory liquidations, appointment of liquidators and receivers, and the disposition of property by will; devolution of property on intestacy; family provision; creation of trusts; grants of probate and administration; rights and duties of executors, administrators and trustees; administration and distribution of estates; death duties; all forms of executorship and trust accounts.

348. Management Mathematics II. C. K. Butt, B.Com. (McGill), M.Sc. (Berkeley). Tuesdays, 7.45-9.15 p.m., starting February 21, 1978. Room 30, Extra-Mural Town Centre, Wing On Centre, 8th Floor, Hong Kong. 10 meetings. Fee: \$80

Businessmen look for optimal solutions to the problems of operating in highly competitive environments. To find such solutions they use quantitative and mathematical techniques. In the second part of this course students will study differential and integral calculus and then apply their knowledge to solve problems in the areas of game theory, statistical decision theory, inventory and queueing problems. Persons who have not attended Part 1 but who have a knowledge of calculus may join the course at this stage.

349. Financial Management and Business Finance. A. M. J. Nash, A.C.M.A., A.M.B.I.M. Fridays, 6.00-7.30 p.m., starting February 17, 1978. Room 847, Knowles Building, University of Hong Kong. 15 meetings.

Fee: \$120

This combination course is designed to be helpful to students studying for examinations of the Institute of Chartered Secretaries and Administrators, Certified Accountants and Cost and Management Accountants. Course contents will include capital investment appraisal, cash flow statements, working capital management, inflation and its effect on financial management, valuation of companies, sources of finance, the effect on financial management of Government legislation, and, cost of capital.

350. Hong Kong Taxation: Principles and Practical Procedures. Y. K. Yu, C.P.A., F.H.K.S.A., A.A.S.A., A.T.I.H.K. Thursdays, 6.00-7.30 p.m., starting February 16, 1978. Extra-Mural Town Centre, Wing On Centre, 8th Floor, Hong Kong. 12 meetings. Fee: \$90

The Hong Kong Inland Revenue Ordinance provides for charges of four main kinds of tax, namely, profits tax, salaries tax, property tax and interest tax. The Ordinance also provides for the availability of personal assessment. This course will introduce the main taxes and consider the implications and effect of personal assessment. The practical applications, as well as basic principles, will be discussed. The course will also cover the procedures for submitting the different types of tax return and the appeal process. Students are advised to obtain a copy of the Hong Kong Inland Revenue Ordinance.

351. Hong Kong Taxation: Law & Practice. (Part 2). Marshall Mar, B.Com. (Melb.), C.P.A., A.H.K.S.A., A.A.S.A., A.M.B.I.M. Wednesdays, 6.00-7.30 p.m., starting February 15, 1978. Room 4, Central Market Building, Top Floor, Hong Kong. 8 meetings. Fee: \$60

In this second part of the course the tutor will discuss the significance of law cases relating to those aspects of the Inland Revenue Ordinance studied in Part 1. Persons with a basic knowledge of the main tax changes, the provisions relating to personal assessment and the procedures of filing tax returns may also join the course at this stage.

Reference book: Hong Kong Inland Revenue Ordinance.

352. Higher Accounting. S. W. Ching, F.C.C.A., F.C.M.A., F.C.I.S., A.I.B., M.B.I.M., F.H.K.S.A. Fridays, 6.00-7.30 p.m., starting February 17, 1978. Extra-Mural Town Centre, Wing On Centre, 8th Floor, Hong Kong. 15 meetings. Fee: \$130

The course aims to give those who have attained L.C.C. Intermediate standard an opportunity to consolidate their knowledge by reviewing the standard practice across a range of accounting topics. The tutor will also introduce more advanced topics such as consolidated accounts, investment and contract accounts and interpretation of accounts.

353. Standard Costing and Budgetary Control. Edward Chow, A.A.S.A., F.H.K.S.A. Fridays, 6.00-7.30 p.m., starting February 17, 1978. Room 4, Central Market Building, Top Floor, Hong Kong. 12 meetings.

Fee: \$90

Standard costing and budgetary control are effective accounting tools in assisting management in its operations and planning. They form part of a modern management system.

This course covers not only the preparation of budgets, the calculation and analysis of standard cost variances, but also the control functions of budgeting and standard costing.

The course requires no prior knowledge of accounting, and is designed for those who wish to gain a better understanding of the accounting tools at their disposal in playing an active part in a management team.

354. Financial Analysis in Business. Gabriel Lee Chi-wang, B.Sc. (H.K.), M.B.A. (Toronto). Fridays, 7.30-9.00 p.m., starting February 17, 1978. Room 20, Extra-Mural Town Centre, Wing On Centre, 8th Floor, Hong Kong. 12 meetings. Fee: \$90

In the conditions of modern business a number of analytical techniques have been developed for solving financial problems within the Company. The theory and practice of such methods will be examined in detail, together with ways of evaluating financial performance, alternative investment opportunities, financial risk and security pricing. The course is designed for junior credit analysts in the fields of banking and finance who wish to gain a greater awareness of modern techniques. It is planned that the course will allow maximum participation by course members in addition to the more formal mode of instruction.

355. An Introduction to Public Administration. I. Scott, B.Sc. (Econ.) (London), M.A., Ph.D. (Toronto). Thursdays, 6.15-7.45 p.m., starting February 16, 1978. Room 228, Knowles Building, University of Hong Kong. 8 meetings. Fee: \$60

This course is designed for those seeking an understanding of public administration in Hong Kong. It will also be useful to those involved in the working of the public services and those who have to deal with Government. Topics to be discussed include the scope and importance of public administration, the nature of bureaucracy, the machinery and organization of government in Hong Kong, the role of the civil servant and the policymaking process, the role of pressure groups, and also the question of ethics and the public service.

356. Company Secretaryship. J. A. Ellis, E.D., F.T.I.A., A.A.S.A., A.A.I.M., A.C.I.S., M.I.T.O. Mondays, 6.00-7.30 p.m., starting February 20, 1978. Room 26, Central Market, Top Floor, Hong Kong. 16 meetings.

The practical aspects of the Company Secretary's job will be described with special reference to the procedures and administration of companies registered under the Hong Kong Companies Ordinance. This course is suitable for students who wish to acquire a basic knowledge of Secretarial Practice for practical use as well as for students taking professional examinations.

MANAGEMENT STUDIES

357. An Introduction to Managerial Techniques. Vincent Ng, B.S., M.B.A., M.S. (UCLA). Wednesdays, 7.45-9.15 p.m., starting February 15, 1978. Room 21, Extra-Mural Town Centre, Wing On Centre, 8th Floor, Hong Kong. 12 meetings. Fee: \$90

Modern managerial activity contains within it elements of both science and art. The evolution of managerial thinking will be examined, including the ideas developed by the Classical, Human Relations, Neo-classical, and Modern Schools of Thought. Attention will also focus on the functions of the executive together with his role in establishing goals and strategy in the business enterprise. A variety of managerial techniques will be considered within the general framework of the need for corporate planning and for decision-making in conditions of uncertainty. Fundamental ideas will be illustrated with practical examples drawn from the financial, marketing and personnel areas of management.

The course will be suitable for young executives without formal knowledge of the full range of management techniques.

358. Management Theory and Practice. K. K. Chong, B.Sc. (Eng.), Dip.M.S. (H.K.), A.M.B.I.M. Tuesdays, 7.45-9.15 p.m., starting February 21, 1978. Room 20, Extra-Mural Town Centre, Wing On Centre, 8th Floor, Hong Kong. 12 meetings. Fee: \$80

The bridge between soundly-conceived management theory and the problems of the practical manager is the focal point of this course. Theoretical concepts will be examined from the point of view of their applicability in today's business conditions with reference to eastern and western influences in managerial style. The problems of change and the reaction of subordinates to change will be considered. The course is designed to help managers to assess their priorities in the non-technical sphere of administration and to stimulate thinking about modes of effective managerial conduct.

359. Elements of Decision Analysis: its application in Management. S. F. Fan, B.Sc., A.M.B.I.M. Mondays, 6.00-7.30 p.m., starting February 20, 1978. Extra-Mural Town Centre, Wing On Centre, 8th Centre, Hong Kong. 12 meetings. Fee: \$90

Guidelines to help the manager improve the effectiveness of his decision-making will be discussed. These take into account the decision-maker's value system and his judgement about the degree of uncertainty involved. Decision methodology is first introduced in terms of a general decision model, and then within this framework, the tutor will discuss the solution of various management problems using techniques such as decision trees, sensitivity analysis, probability analysis, utility assessment and discounting methods. The emphasis will be on giving an appreciation both of the ideas and their application.

360. Management for International Operations. P. J. Au, B.Sc., M.B.A. (N.Y.U.). Mondays, 6.00-7.30 p.m., starting February 20, 1978. Extra-Mural Town Centre, Wing On Centre, 8th Floor, Hong Kong. 8 meetings. Fee: \$100

The course is designed for practising managers who have not yet taken a post degree course in International Business. It will also be of interest to those involved in firms doing business in more than one country. Topics covered include: the challenge of international operations; organizing for international business; nationalism-government and corporate responses; ways of doing business abroad including licensing, joint venture, consortium, management contrasts and territory projects; financing international operations; foreign exchange strategy/management; international business negotiation.

361. Introduction to Operational Research. F. K. W. Mak, Ph.D. (London), C.Eng., M.I. Mech.E. Tuesdays, 7.00-8.30 p.m., starting February 21, 1978. Committee Room North, City Hall, 7th Floor, Hong Kong. 12 meetings. Fee: \$80

Operational Research is a most useful technique for all managers and administrators, enabling them to understand and use advanced methods of information collection, processing and control which lead to a more efficient organization. Students should have a basic knowledge of algebra but all other mathematical concepts will be explained. The course has been designed to suit those who have no previous knowledge of Operational Research and to act as an introductory course for those who wish to pursue more advanced studies in this area.

362. Materials Management: a Modern Interpretation. S. H. Symington, H.N.C., M.Inst. P.S., A.M.B.I.M. Wednesdays, 6.00-7.30 p.m., starting February 15, 1978. Room 20, Extra-Mural Town Centre, Wing On Centre, 8th Floor, Hong Kong. 10 meetings. Fee: \$75

Materials Management is one of the major functions in industrial, commercial and governmental organizations. The term indicates an attempt to manage and control the total flow of materials from selection of supplier, through inventory control into production, and, in certain cases, after processing into the finished product, distribution to the customer.

This course will benefit managers who are responsible for all or part of the purchasing, inventory control or stores activities. Topics covered will include various management techniques which can be applied specifically to the solving of material management problems.

363. Psychology and the Manager. Poon Wai-keung, B.A., M.Ed., Ph.D. (Toronto). Wednesdays, 8.00-9.30 p.m., starting February 15, 1978. Room 22, Extra-Mural Town Centre, Wing On Centre, 8th Floor, Hong Kong. 12 meetings. Fee: \$90

The proper exercise of authority and responsibility by a Manager in the work context of today requires a knowledge of the important psychological principles which lie behind human behaviour. The conceptual basis of the motivation of people within organizations will be discussed, with particular reference to the development of attitudes and values, the roles of the individual and the group, and the phenomena of morale, frustration and leadership. Theoretical and practical views will also be studied in relation to the problems of Conflict Resolution, Decision-making, Counselling and Interviewing, and a review will be made of the psychological aspects of Manpower Planning, Job Analysis, Recruitment and Selection Methods, the Design of Jobs and Industrial Training. The course has been designed to be of special interest to Personnel specialists as well as Line Managers who wish to extend their knowledge in this area.

364. An Introduction to Industrial Relations in Hong Hong. Leung Wai-on, M.Sc. (Dunelm), D.M.S., A.M.B.I.M. Mondays, 7.45-9.15 p.m., starting February 20, 1978. Room 22, Extra-Mural Town Centre, Wing On Centre, 8th Floor, Hong Kong. 10 meetings. Fee: \$80

The promotion of sound policies in the field of Industrial Relations is a subject of increasing attention amongst employers and government in Hong Kong. This course will trace the historical background and development of interest in labour matters in line with the emergence of Hong Kong as a major manufacturing area in Asia. Emphasis will be placed on defining the role of Management and Trade Unions in the resolution of conflict and on the development of overall strategies for harmonious industrial relations. The course has been designed on an introductory basis for Personnel Officers, Junior Executives and those interested in Industrial Relations whether working in the public or private sectors.

367. Hongkong Statistics for Business. Tuesdays, 6.30-8.30 p.m., starting February 21, 1978. Room 726, Knowles Building, University of Hong Kong. 14 meetings. Fee: \$220 including publications and reports

This course is a development of the successful first course in cooperation with the Census and Statistics Department last year. The course is designed to put managers, administrators and planners in closer touch with the statistical data available in Hong Kong, and to show how such data may be used to assist in business and forecasting for administration. The course is an integrated series of lecture/seminars by experts in the field.

A series of eight sessions concentrating on practical aspects of doing business with the People's Republic of China. Topics include: modus operandi of the foreign trade corporation, standard—and not so standard—terms of purchase and sale, common problems and ways to solve them, the Canton trade fair and the rise of the mini-fair, promotion of foreign technology (covering product advertising, technical exchanges and industrial exhibition) and the ever-growing role of Hong Kong.

369. Principles of Economics I. M. T. Cheung, M.Sc., Ph.D. (London), Lecturer in Economics, University of Hong Kong. Thursdays, 6.15-7.45 p.m., starting February 16, 1978. Room 103, University Main Building. 12 meetings. Fee: \$100

An introductory survey of traditional price theory and national income analysis. The Economics will be explained simply but critically, with application to the problems of everyday life and business decisions whenever possible. This course may be suitable for candidates preparing for professional examinations requiring a paper in Economics.

370. Principles of Economics II. Ma Sai-kwong, B.A. (Washington State), M.A. (McMaster), Demonstrator in Economics, University of Hong Kong. Mondays, 6.15-7.45 p.m., starting February 20, 1978. Room 228, Knowles Building, University of Hong Kong. 8 meetings. Fee: \$80

Further topics in price theory and national income analysis. The approach is more general and abstract than that in Principles of Economics I, but the topics covered will have more relevance to real life situations.

371. Economics of Business Enterprise. S. F. Fan, B.Sc. (Econ.) (London), A.M.B.I.M. Saturdays, 2.00-3.30 p.m., starting February 18, 1978. Extra-Mural Town Centre, Wing On Centre, 8/F. 14 meetings.

Fee: \$120

The course is designed for practising managers in the business and industrial sectors who want to acquire an understanding of the economic theory relevant to their business life. The firm will be treated as a decision-making unit under various market structures. Topics covered include economies of scale, industrial demand curve, diversification and vertical integration. The course is essentially practical and only an elementary knowledge of economics is assumed. Guest speakers from business and industry will show the application of the principles to the practical aspects of business enterprise.

A basic survey of econometrics which is the statistical estimation of economic relationships. Topics covered include: model building, single equation models, identification problems of simultaneous equation models and simple estimation techniques. Applicants should have a fair knowledge of economics, statistics and mathematics.

ENGLISH FOR APPRECIATION

399. Introduction to East-West Comparative Literature. T. W. Wong, B.A. (Nat. Taiwan), M.A., Ph.D. (Wash.), Lecturer in East-West Comparative Literature, University of Hong Kong. Mondays, 6.15-7.45 p.m., starting April 3, 1978. Room 150, Main Building, University of Hong Kong. 10 meetings.

What is comparative literature? The course will serve to explain the name and nature, introduce the concepts (e.g. the concept of influence, the concept of literary period and movement), and clarify the scope (e.g. the comparison of two or more national literatures or the comparison of literature with other disciplines), of comparative literature as a trend of world literature study. Major methods adopted by literary comparatists will be discussed, with examples drawn mainly from scholarly works on East-West literary relations. A comprehensive survey of the critical efforts attempted in this latter area (more specifically, Chinese/Japanese-American/European) will be given to illustrate the viability of the discipline in question. The course will eventually focus on the problems of adopting

foreign terms and of applying Western methodology to the study of Chinese literature as well as on the phenomena of oriental influence upon

modern/contemporary American poetry.

A quantity of stencilled material will be made available to those attending the course, and Chinese speaking students should obtain a copy of *The Dream of the Red Chamber*. Non-Chinese speaking students should obtain copies of this novel that has been published under the title *The Story of The Stone*, D. Hawkes (Penguin Classics, Vols. 1 and 2). This is available from the Hong Kong Book Centre, 25 Des Voeux Road Central, Hong Kong.

404. Geotechnical & Geophysical Methods: Recent Development & their Applications in Modern Building Industry.

Modern building industry demands the successful application of various disciplines in order to attain its maximum efficiency. Geotechnical & Geophysical methods can, if intelligently applied, play a key role in the success of a building project.

This course is designed to provide practising civil engineers with a background knowledge of some of the recent developments in geotechnical and geophysical methods, and their applications in modern building industry.

Selected topics include:

Rock mechanics: properties of intact rocks and their measurement, shear strength of jointed rocks, geophysics.

Rock slope stability: rock joint survey and graphical presentation on stereonets, methods of slope stability analysis, theory and design of rock anchors.

Infiltration theories: infiltration of rain water into unprotected slopes and its effect of slope stability, physics of unsaturated flow.

Vibration theories: propogation and damping of stress waves resulting from such sources as earthquake, blasting and vibratory machines, applications (e.g. vibratory pile driving) and damaging effects (e.g. cracking of structures) of vibration.

Field instrumentation: principles of measurement, design and installation of instruments (e.g. piezometer slope indicator, earth pressure cell, accelerometer etc.).

In addition, there will be five laboratory sessions, offering those who attend an opportunity to familiarize themselves with some of the more specialised but useful tests such as rock joint shear strength test, rock triaxial tests and infiltration test.

Be it out of necessity, admiration, or imitation, the question of how to borrow from the West has perplexed China ever since the beginning of the Western intrusion, and it is still an important issue in today's China. Hence an understanding of the modern Chinese "mind" definitely requires a look into the historical background of the interplay between traditional Chinese ideas and those from the West. The course will investigate in depth the following areas: Chinese Concepts of Western Diplomacy; Chinese Xenophobia and the anti-Christian Tradition; t'i (basis) versus yung (application); introduction of Huxley and Social Darwinism; Universal World Order and Revolution; Anti-Confucianism and Western Liberalism; introduction of Socialism and Communism; and Maoism and Peasant Nationalism.

While the general perspective of this course is an objective presentation of the characteristics, spirit and creeds of Chinese and European cultures, where they agree and where they conflict with each other, discussion will concentrate mainly on the philosophical outlooks of these cultures on the following topics: individual and society; tradition and change; science and learning; virtue and happiness.

This course tries neither to be comprehensive nor didactic, but merely to provide an example of how our cultural background may be appraised and understood. The structure and function of particular flowers in these families will be considered and the student will be encouraged to relate such features to the systematic position of the species concerned.

Medical Laboratory Science

Advanced Courses in Medical Laboratory Science.

These are the first of a series of specialist courses on topics of current medical interest. Particular attention will be paid to new techniques of use in diagnostic laboratories. These courses are intended for post-Higher Certificate students in medical laboratory technology or medical laboratory scientists. All others who are interested may also apply but a fundamental knowledge of medical laboratory science is desirable in view of the specialist nature of the courses. The topics centre around the four major medical specialist subjects i.e. medical microbiology, clinical chemistry, haematology and serology and histopathology and cytology. In the first instance, the former two subjects are being offered, the latter two will be offered in the next series. The lectures are given by clinicians and scientists who are experts in their fields. Each lecture will be followed by relevant demonstrations.

495. Medical Microbiology.

Some of the problems encountered in the laboratory diagnosis of Salmonellosis will be considered. In particular, a critical review of laboratory diagnostic methods based on a) isolation procedure, b) immunological methods, and c) drug sensitivity tests will be presented.

The laboratory diagnosis of urinary tract infection will be the second main topic discussed. A modified loop-method for the quantitative evaluation of bacterial counts will be presented, and the significance of an increase in the white-cell excretion rate will be considered.

496. Clinical Chemistry.

The competition-binding assay is a potentially useful method for assaying the morphine level in the blood of a drug addict. Both the method and its limitations will be discussed.

Advances in diagnostic enzymology will then be considered. Isoenzymes are useful for the differential diagnosis of tissue-specific abnormalities. A number of specific quantitative methods are now available based on various principles including radiochemical, immunological and electrophoretic techniques. A critical review of the various methods and novel applications will be presented.

(London.), Ph.D. (Bath), F.I.S., F.S.S., F.I.Q.A., Senior Lecturer in Statistics, University of Hong Kong, and will show how, when properly controlled, data can be presented with meaningful results.

497. Current Trends in Social Work with Groups. Miss Lola E. Buckley, M.S.W., D.S.W. (S.California), Visiting Professor, Department of Social Work, University of Hong Kong. Thursdays, 4.00-6.30 p.m., starting February 16, 1978. Extra-Mural Town Centre. 6 meetings.

Fee: \$90

This is a refresher and survey course for experienced professional social workers. The focus will be on some of the current issues and major developments in the use of groups. It is intended to deepen and help participants consolidate their understanding of the appropriateness of the various group approaches to different client populations, such as:

Encounter Groups Counselling Groups Marathon Groups Educational Groups T-Groups Developmental Groups Group Supervision Assertiveness Training Groups Self Awareness Groups Therapy Groups, etc.

This will include: examination of the similarities and peculiarities of these groups; their potential application and problems likely to be encountered; and exploration of the worker role and techniques desirable for organizing such groups.

Class members themselves will be asked to share in group interaction to create maximum understanding of some of the methods. Some specific exercises will be demonstrated, including Family Sculpturing, Genogram and Eco-map. Specific problems in working with groups as experienced by participants will also be discussed.

Enrolment is limited to 20.

498. Counselling Specifics for Workers in the Helping Professions. Peter M. Whyte, Dean of Students, University of Hong Kong. Tuesdays, 6.00-8.00 p.m., starting February 21, 1978. Room 230, Knowles Building, University of Hong Kong. 12 meetings. Fee: \$140

The first four lectures will explore the principles and constructs of Counselling, the skills which a counsellor must develop, and systematically study the universal qualities of clients.

The succeeding eight lectures will deal with specific problem areas or counselling approaches. Some of the topics which will be treated are: death, privacy, hostility, the disturbed family, the disturbed child, hypnosis and relaxation, the sexually disturbed, communication techniques and group experience.

兒童院家長在工作上雖然得到各方面的幫助,但面對一羣來自不同背景的兒童,很多時仍有徬徨、孤單及困悶的感覺。同時,兒童院家長工作之價值,很多時被其他有關人仕或兒童院家長本身所低估。

本課程旨在導引兒童院家長覺察其角色之重要及對其受照顧的兒童影響之深遠,並提高彼等注意對何時需要徵募其他專業人仕給予支持性的服務,如社會工作者,心理學者及醫務人員等。本課程並簡單介紹此等專業人員的工作,特別着重社會工作者與兒童院家長在工作關係上所扮演的角色,蓋因此處容易產生很多誤解與差錯的概念,引致對兒童的照顧有損。

本課程有異於慣常的上課形式,將以小組討論為基礎,而並非一連串 授課者對學生的演講,故參加本課程的學員將會被要求提供其在工作上所遇 到的實例,希望透過以討論為主、角色扮演、有關參考資料的介紹,問卷及 短講等活動,從而達到啓廸兒童院家長對自己所扮演的角色及對可能協助其 工作的資源之運用有更進一步之認識。

本課程特別爲兒童院家長而設,經驗年資不拘,因爲不同的經驗更能 刺激良佳的討論。限收十五人。

由於香港並無有系統性之離散工作訓練,而此類工作將有長足發展之 趨勢,本課程希望能稍填補此種不足,課程內容包括有關之理論及學說,工 作目標及過程,工作紀錄及督導,評估方法,此外並將介紹離散青年之心理 狀態及生活模式,小組活動及個人行為,離散工作在香港之推行情況,尤其 注重此項工作在香港實際環境中方法與技巧之運用。


