

GENERAL INFORMATION

- r. There are normally no entry requirements except that applicants should be over 18 years of age. Occasionally to have the full benefit of a course applicants must possess certain defined qualifications. Applicants are therefore advised to read the description of a course carefully. Professional courses usually have clearly defined entry requirements.
- 2. The Director may at his discretion refuse to admit an applicant.
- 3. Unless otherwise arranged, no Extra-Mural lectures will be held:
 - (a) on any public holidays.
 - (b) at a storm warning signal of No. 8 or above. (After the typhoon passes, if the No. 8 signal is lowered before 3 p.m., classes will take place as normal. If the signal is lowered after 3 p.m., classes will be cancelled that evening.)
- 4. Fees are not refundable once the course has commenced.
- 5. Certificates of Attendance are issued, on payment of 50 cents, to those who have attended not less than two-thirds of a course of at least 20 meetings in duration.
- **6.** Closing date for enrolment: one week before the starting date of a course. Late enrolments may not be accepted.

Courses in Art & Design and related areas are open to students of all levels of development unless otherwise stated.

PRACTICAL STUDIO COURSES IN ART & DESIGN

These are practical studio classes in the Visual Arts with emphasis on artistic skills and creative growth of the individual. Work will be carried out in the various media described.

Students must provide all necessary materials, some of which will be available for purchase through the department. Materials will be discussed at the first class meeting.

336. Introduction to Traditional Watercolour Painting. Robert O'Brien, Dip.A.D. Mondays, 6.00–8.00 p.m., starting February 12, 1979. Room II, Extra-Mural Town Centre, 8th floor, Wing On Centre, 111 Connaught Road Central, Hong Kong. 12 meetings. Fee: \$140

The Western approach to watercolour painting differs considerably from Oriental styles both in emphasis and technique. With still-life, nature objects, and other figurative subjects as take-off points, students will explore techniques basic to traditional Western watercolour painting, including: washes, glazing, dry brush, layering and others. Specific projects will be set each week which will facilitate growth in, and understanding of, the media.

337. Experimental Watercolour Painting. Robert O'Brien, Dip.A.D. Tuesdays, 8.00–10.00 p.m., starting February 13, 1979. Room 11, Extra-Mural Town Centre, 8th floor, Wing On Centre, 111 Connaught Road Central, Hong Kong. 12 meetings. Fee: \$140

As watercolour painting is one of the few techniques that can be used in spontaneous and unfamiliar ways, it offers the student many exciting possibilities to explore. Students will experiment with various combinations of water based media, including traditional watercolour, inks, poster colour and acrylics as applied to western and Chinese papers, canvas and fabrics in an attempt to discover some of the possibilities and applications.

338. Life Drawing. Peter Chancellor, Dip.A.D. (Birmingham), A.T.D. (London). Wednesdays or Fridays, 6.00-8.00 p.m., starting February 14 and 16, 1979, respectively. Room 10, Extra-Mural Town Centre, 8th floor, Wing On Centre, 111 Connaught Road Central, Hong Kong. 12 meetings.

Fee: \$195 including model fee

Drawing from the human figure provides a discipline which develops visual perception and correlation of hand and eye. This course will include basic anatomy and drawing from life. A variety of media will be used including crayon, chalk, ink, pencil and paint and students will be encouraged to try a variety of graphic techniques to the point of experimentation. Reference to artists both old and modern will be made. Beginners and more advanced students are welcome.

Enrolment is limited to 17 students.

339. Painting Workshop in Oil, Acrylic, and Related Media. Martha Lesser, B.S. (N.Y.U.). Thursdays, 6.00-8.00 p.m., starting February 15, 1979. Room 10, Extra-mural Town Centre, 8th floor, Wing On Centre, 111 Connaught Road Central, Hong Kong. 12 meetings.

Fee: \$160 including model fee

Through paint, and the related media of collage, drawing, transfer and others, students in this intermediate level course will explore aesthetic and philosophic concepts of painting. Emphasis will be placed on learning to discover and communicate one's own ideas through visual and technical means. The basic questions of materials, composition, and use of colour will be discussed throughout the course, and students will receive guidance on how to set and achieve their aims in painting. As painting is an ongoing activity, students at various levels of skill and experience are welcome, but it should be pointed out that some previous experience in drawing, design or other related subjects is essential, and it is expected that students will do a minimum of six hours homework each week. The studio will remain open until 9.30 p.m. so that students wishing to continue work begun that evening can do so. In the event of oversubscription an interview will be required.

PRIOR ENROLMENT IS ESSENTIAL

Prior enrolment is the only way the Department of Extra-Mural Studies has of judging the response to its courses. 340. Introduction to Linocut Printmaking. Neil Cairney, Dip.A.D. Thursdays, 6.30–8.30 p.m., starting February 15, 1979. Pokfulam Studio, 144 Pokfulam Road, Hong Kong. 12 meetings.

Linocut printmaking is a bold and exciting medium in which a wide range of effects in line, texture, and colour can be achieved. The course will include demonstrations on the technical and aesthetic qualities of this print medium. The exploration by students during this course will be from simple, single colour prints to multiple colour and rainbow-roll prints. As linocuts require fewer tools and less space than other print media, its practice can be easily carried on by the students outside of class time.

Students will be expected to provide most drawing and cutting materials. Some inks and sundries for use during class time will be provided, and the

cost of these is included in the course fee.

341. Children's Arts and Crafts Activities: a Workshop for Adults. Sylvia Weiss, A.T.C. (Univ. of London). Tuesdays, 6.30-8.30 p.m., starting February 13, 1979. Pokfulam Studio, 144 Pokfulam Road, Hong Kong. 12 meetings.

It is important for a child's growth and development to have creative activities, such as arts and crafts, integrated into home and school life. Such activities help develop a child's creativity, dexterity, and intellect. This course is designed for parents, teachers, and other adults who work with pre-school, and school-age children, and will demonstrate art and craft activities suitable for these age groups. Emphasis will be on the uses of simple, inexpensive, materials and the students themselves will participate in a variety of projects in order to better understand the basic concepts and techniques.

Students will be expected to provide most of their own tools and materials. Some paints and papers for use during class time will be provided and the cost of these is included in the course fee.

342. Interior Decoration. Robert Griffiths. Wednesdays, 6.00-8.00 p.m., starting February 14, 1979. Room 11, Extra-Mural Town Centre, 8th floor, Wing On Centre, III Connaught Road Central, Hong Kong. 12 meetings. Fee: \$140

Intended as a basic introduction to the skill of interior decoration, this course will cover: conceptual design and simple planning, proportion and scale, effects of colour and colour schemes, and materials and finishes. Assignments will be concentrated on small projects. Students should note that they will be expected to work at least five hours a week outside of class.

Enrolment is limited to 22 students, and in the event of oversubscription an interview will be required.

343. Graphic Design Practice in Hong Kong. Henry Steiner, M.F.A. (Yale). Wednesdays, 6.15-7.45 p.m., starting February 14, 1979. Room 14, Extra-Mural Town Centre, 8th floor, Wing On Centre, 111 Connaught Road Central, Hong Kong. 6 meetings. Fee: \$55

The following practical and aesthetic aspects of the design profession in Hong Kong will be examined: design as a career, production, creativity, professionalism, client relations, systems of charging, and prospects for the near future. Classes will be varied in their presentation, including lectures, panel discussions, and showing of work.

344. Introduction to Photography. Bob Bradford, B.P.A. (Brooks Inst. Santa Barbara). Wednesdays, 6.00–8.00 p.m. or 8.00–10.00 p.m., starting February 14, 1979. Room 13, Extra-Mural Town Centre, 8th floor, Wing On Centre, 111 Connaught Road Central, Hong Kong. 12 meetings. Fee: \$170

Aimed at those with a serious interest in photography as a vehicle for expression and communication, this course will cover the basic studio and darkroom techniques of black and white and colour photography as well as choices of equipment and materials. In addition, theories of photography, both aesthetic and philosophic, will be explored. Students will be expected to experiment in the media, and class critiques will be held on the results of these.

Students must provide their own cameras. Basic darkroom materials and supplies to be used during class sessions will be provided, and the cost of these is included in the course fee.

345. Photography: an Intermediate Course. Philip Tse. Mondays, 7.00-9.00 p.m., starting February 12, 1979. Room 13, Extra-Mural Town Centre, 8th floor, Wing On Centre, 111 Connaught Road Central, Hong Kong. 12 meetings. Fee: \$205

In recent years photography has come to be accepted as a fine art form in its own right. The emphasis in this course will be on 'creativity and aesthetics', and is designed for those already familiar with the basic technical aspects of photography and photographic equipment. While most of the work will deal with black and white photography, colour processing will be introduced. There will be four class field trips to a variety of sites on Saturday and Sunday afternoons, and class critiques will be held on the results of these as well as of studio and independent work.

Chemicals and papers will be provided for use during class sessions, and the cost of these is included in the fee.

Enrolment is limited to 15 persons, and in the event of oversubscription an interview will be held.

346. Photography as an Aid to the Graphic Designer. Philip Tse. Tuesdays, 7.00-9.00 p.m., starting February 13, 1979. Room 13, Extra-Mural Town Centre, 8th floor, Wing On Centre, 111 Connaught Road Central, Hong Kong. 12 meetings. Fee: \$175

Photography, because it achieves optical effects never known before, plays a vital part today in a designer's work, and techniques of photographics open up completely new vistas. Tuition will include studio and darkroom procedure within the designer's capabilities, detailing some of the many effects which can be achieved by simple manipulation at the developing and printing stages. Colour work, distortion of straightforward images, special screening effects, photo layout, photo mural, graphic art photography, photo dyeing techniques and advertising photography will be discussed. Emphasis will be on practical darkroom work, and there will be a visit to a printer's darkroom.

This intermediate level course is intended for those with a basic know-ledge of darkroom procedure. Papers, chemicals and other materials for use during class time will be supplied, and the cost of these has been included in the course fee.

Enrolment is limited to 15 persons, and in the event of oversubscription an interview will be held.

347. 初級攝影

(Photography: an Introduction)

攝影是素描,相機是藍筆,攝影是最快捷之素描技巧。

本課程將介紹攝影器材應用技術給初學攝影人仕,以最短期內學習到 各種有關攝影常識,使能在攝影中得到更多樂趣。

348. 素描 寫生

(Introduction to Western Style Drawing)

主 講 人:李維安先生。

講授語言: 粵語。

時 間:一九七九年二月十二日起每星期一下午六時至八時或八時

至十時。(共十二講)。

本課程爲初學者而設,以繪畫之基本技法訓練開始,以西方繪畫之素描意義爲中心,務使學員能將每種人畫之對像以光暗、形態、實質與空間之學習表現,當中將會涉及中國繪畫之白描寫生與及臨莽等過程,學員除在室內上課外,並有假日郊外寫生,幻燈觀摩等輔助。

本課程首四講爲靜物寫生,次四講爲人物逃寫,最後四講爲人體素描。學量須自備鉛筆、炭筆、墨水筆及其他毛筆畫紙等工具。

學員每週須付出四至六小時課外習作。

349. 素描與繪畫探討

(Western Style Drawing: an Intermediate Course)

本課程適宜有素描基礎之學員就讀,內容將闡述素描與繪畫的一般觀 念問題,並强調一般所謂素描基礎在創作上實際所須的運用和思考上的探 討,以古時畫家作品及當時所產生的潮流派別的形式和風格,與我們在學習 上應站的態度和我們生活環境的關係。有模特兒寫作,幻燈片討論,意象繪 寫練習,室外寫生指導等。

學員須自備工具,每週須付出四至六小時課外習作。

名額限收二十名,如報名人數超過上述限額時,將會邀請申請者到市區中心進行面試。

350. 兜童美衔教學與欣賞

(How to Teach and Appreciate Children's Art: a Workshop for Parents and Teachers)

時 間:一九七九年二月十三日起每星期二下午六時至八時。

本課程將剛並兒童美術之教育功能與重要性,尤其着重探討兒童美術 教育之原則與觀念及有關如何培養與路發兒童美術創作之想像力與智慧、 潛能等問題,並介紹兒童美術宜採用之技法,媒介與物料,以供參考。

此課程適宜小學美術教師及對兒童美術有興趣之人士選修,學員須作 兒童美術範圍內之各種質驗性嘗試,物料自備。

研討範圍:藝術定義;美術教育的目的;兒童在成長中各階段美術發展之特徵;小學前之美術教育原則;小學時期之美術教育原則;中學時期之美術教育原則;教學計劃之研究;兒童美術創作之技巧、媒介、物料與方法;兒童美術之欣賞。

DAYTIME COURSES

351. Life Drawing. Martha Lesser, B.S. (N.Y.U.). Mondays, 10.00 a.m.—12.00 noon, starting February 12, 1979. Room 10, Extra-Mural Town Centre, 8th floor, Wing On Centre, 111 Connaught Road Central, Hong Kong. 12 meetings. Fee: \$195 including model fee

The contrasts and changes of form within the human body make it an ideal subject for continuing study and practice in drawing. Using a variety of media including graphite, chalks, charcoal, poster colours, crayons, felt pens, and others, students will explore and experiment with mass, tone, line, plastic space and other drawing elements. Both beginners and more advanced students are welcome.

Enrolment is limited to 17 students. Students will be expected to complete homework assignments each week.

352. Experimental Watercolour Painting. Nancy Woo, B.F.A. (Cornell), M.A. (Columbia). Tuesdays, 10.00 a.m.-12.00 noon, starting February 13, 1979. Room 11, Extra-Mural Town Centre, 8th floor, Wing On Centre, 111 Connaught Road Central, Hong Kong. 12 meetings. Fee: \$140

In this experimental and creative approach to watercolour painting students will be exposed to various aspects of modern watercolour techniques. The water based media to be used include watercolour, commercial dyes, Chinese colour pigments, inks, and polymer media. This course will broadly cover the fundamentals of materials and techniques for beginners and offer a challenge to the more ambitious painter.

353. Introduction to Traditional Watercolour Painting. Robert O'Brien, Dip.A.D. Wednesdays, 10.00 a.m.—12.00 noon, starting February 14, 1979. Room 11, Extra-Mural Town Centre, 8th floor, Wing On Centre, 111 Connaught Road Central, Hong Kong. 12 meetings. Fee: \$140

ART APPRECIATION

These are lecture and discussion courses open to all students regardless of previous Art History study.

354. The Human Figure in Western Art. Carolyn Diskant Muir, B.A. (Wellesley), M.A. (Penn.). Mondays, 6.15-7.45 p.m., starting February 19, 1979. Room 14, Extra-Mural Town Centre, 8th floor, Wing On Centre, 111 Connaught Road Central, Hong Kong. 10 meetings. Fee: \$90

Western art has been characterized by a strong interest in the portrayal of the human form. This illustrated course will examine how Western artists have chosen to depict the human figure from antiquity to modern times, and the external factors which have affected their choices. Topics to be discussed will include the nude; portraiture; religious, allegorical, and rustic scenes; the relationship between the figure and landscape; and the expressive power of gestures and poses. Examples will be chosen from all periods of Western art and comparisons will be made with the art of other cultures.

355. Women Artists: an Uphill Struggle. Carolyn Diskant Muir, B.A. (Wellesley), M.A. (Univ. of Penn.). Wednesdays, 6.15-7.45 p.m., starting March 21, 1979. Room 14, Extra-Mural Town Centre, 8th floor, Wing On Centre, 111 Connaught Road Central, Hong Kong. 6 meetings. Fee: \$55

Women artists, like women in other fields, have encountered many obstacles in pursuing their training and in achieving recognition. Of those whose talents and skills were acknowledged in their own time, only the names of a few have found their way into the male dominated world of Art History. With the recently expanded interest in women's achievement the "forgotten" artists are being rediscovered, and women artists of our time are beginning to find their rightful place. This short illustrated course will examine the situation of women artists over the past several centuries, their problems and successes, and the reasons for them. In addition, six short films portraying the lives of six living artists, Georgia O'Keefe, Louise Nevelson, Helen Frankenthaler, Mary Cassatt, Betty Saar, and Alice Neal, will be shown and discussed.

356. History and Appreciation of Chinese Flower and Bird Painting. Harold Wong. Thursdays, 6.00-7.30 p.m., starting February 15, 1979. Room 22, Extra-Mural Town Centre, 8th floor, Wing On Centre, 111 Connaught Road Central, Hong Kong. 12 meetings. Fee: \$100

A few bold strokes depicting a bamboo plant swaying in the wind; splashes of colour and ink to create a cluster of peonies; or a delicately painted bird flying over a lotus pond. These are some of the many popular themes and subjects which reflect the mood of the artist or the season, and many of which have symbolic meaning.

The course is structured to help beginners grasp the basic elements of the art of flower and bird painting through visual aids, such as slides, reproductions, and demonstrations on the blackboard. The meticulous style using lines and colours and the subsequent development into a freer brushwork with emphasis on inktones are some of the major topics to be discussed.

357. An Introduction to the Art of India & South-east Asia. Mrs. Rajeshwari Ghose, B.A. (Calcutta), M.A. (H.K.). Fridays, 6.00-7.30 p.m., starting February 16, 1979. Room 22, Extra-Mural Town Centre, Wing On Centre, 8th floor, III Connaught Road Central, Hong Kong. 14 meetings.

Fee: \$00

This illustrated course will provide a glimpse into the highlights of Hindu-Buddhist art in India and South-east Asia. It will briefly study the religious impulses which influenced the nature, style and spirit of the sacred art of this region and will analyse the main schools of art and architecture in India. It will also examine the two strands of traditions—Indic and 'native' in the composition of South-east Asian art and culture leading to a study of the major art forms of Cambodia, Indonesia, Thailand and Burma.

Courses Nos. 358 to 371 are designed to be of assistance to those preparing for the examinations of the Association of Certified Accountants, the Institute of Cost and Management Accountants and the Institute of Chartered Secretaries and Administrators. The courses are a complement to, not a substitute for, correspondence courses. Students should make their own arrangements for sitting the relevant examinations.

358. Financial Accounting I: Foundation Stage. J. D. Lane, M.A., A.C.I.S., A.I.B. Tuesdays, 6.15-8.15 p.m., starting February 13, 1979. Room II, Central Market, Top Floor, Hong Kong. 14 meetings. Fee: \$120

This course is intended for students who are embarking on the study of accounting and have little or no previous experience of the subject. The intention is, however, that the course will follow the syllabus of the A.C.C.A. Accounting I paper.

The main topics covered are as follows: principles involved in the keeping of records of financial transactions, trial balance and final accounts of sole traders and partnerships, capital and revenue expenditure, elements of depreciation, accruals and prepayments, accounts of non-trading institutions, manufacturing accounts, departmental accounts and an introduction to the accounts of companies. In addition, topical aspects in relation to Accounting will be discussed.

359. Intermediate Accounting. Warren Lowe, Dip. Tech. (Comm.), A.A.S.A., A.H.K.S.A. Tuesdays, 6.15-8.15 p.m., starting February 20, 1979. Room 167, University Main Building, 12 meetings. Fee: \$110

Partnership accounts, including change of partners and conversion to limited companies, and company accounts, including the issue of shares and debentures, are amongst subjects which will be covered in this course set at the intermediate level. Designed for students who have a good working knowledge of basic accounting principles, the course will also deal with final accounts for publication, the treatment of taxation in company accounts and the interpretation of accounts, including flow of funds statements.

360. Advanced Financial Accounting. Mrs. S. Panchapakesan, B.Sc., A.C.A. Tuesdays, 6.15–8.15 p.m., starting February 20, 1979. Room 103, University Main Building. 14 meetings. Fee: \$130

The tutor will select topics from the A.C.C.A. syllabus for Accounting 4. This syllabus covers group accounts, principles of consolidation, theory in relation to the nature and measurement of business income, aspects of financial statement construction, presentation and interpretation of accounts, accounting treatment of reorganisation and amalgamations and accounting for price level changes. These topics will be treated at the highest level.

361. Data Processing and Systems Design. Paul Yan, F.I.D.P., F.L.M.I., A.M.B.I.M. Tuesdays, 6.00-7.30 p.m., starting February 13, 1979. Room 30, Extra-Mural Town Centre, Wing On Centre, 8th floor, 111 Connaught Road Central, Hong Kong. 15 meetings. Fee: \$100

Students will be introduced to the various parts of a computer system with emphasis on data storage and transmission equipment; the principles of data collecting, recording, storing and processing; systems analysis and design including the charting of systems; and also the development and carrying out of feasibility studies. Relevant cases studies and examples will be introduced and students will be expected to work through examination questions.

362. Economics and the Business Environment. Lui Wing Ku, B.Com., A.C.A. (Aust.) A.A.S.A., A.C.I.S., A.H.K.S.A. Fridays, 5.45-7.15 starting February 16, 1979. Room 30, Extra-Mural Town Centre, Wing On Centre, 8th floor, Hong Kong. 15 meetings. Fee: \$120

Price theory; demand and supply, elasticity; production theory; distribution theory and factor pricing are some of the economic theories to be considered in this course. The class will also consider microeconomic issues such as ownership and control, monopolies and mergers as well as national income and national product, and macroeconomic issues such as monetary and fiscal stabilisation policy, taxation, incomes policy and economic growth. This course is based on the syllabus of the Association of Certified Accountants.

363. Statistics for Accountants. K. G. Jones, B.Com. (Melbourne), F.C.C.A., F.H.K.S.A., F.A.S.A., A.C.I.S., Principal Lecturer, Hong Kong Polytechnic. Saturdays, 2.30-4.30 p.m., starting February 17, 1979. Room 20, Extra-Mural Town Centre, Wing On Centre, 8th floor, 111 Connaught Road Central, Hong Kong. 12 meetings. Fee: \$120

The aim of this course is to give students an understanding of the nature of statistical relationships and how to interpret them as an aid in business planning and control. The course will follow the A.C.C.A. syllabus and topics to be studied include, the nature of statistics, sources, interpretation and collection of data, how to summarise and present data, statistical inference, introductory probability, sampling, correlation and regression, and measurement of change.

364. Costing. Charles Kwok, B.A. (Econ.), B.Sc. (Bus. Admin.) Thursdays, 6.15-8.15 p.m., starting February 15, 1979. Room 229, Knowles Building, University of Hong Kong. 14 meetings. Fee: \$120

The main areas of study will be: costing for materials, labour and overheads, job costing and process costing, breakeven analysis, profit volume ratio, marginal costing, introduction to standard costing, and variance analysis. The course will be particularly useful to students taking the A.C.C.A./A.C.M.A. Costing I examination.

365. Auditing. Stephen Lau, A.C.A., A.H.K.S.A. Mondays, 8.00-9.30 p.m., starting February 19, 1979. Room 722, Knowles Building, University of Hong Kong. 12 meetings. Fee: \$90

Following the ACCA syllabus, topics to be discussed and studied are, the validity of principles in public reporting, types of investigations, forms of audit report and the effectiveness of legislation in protecting interested parties, the effect of computers on audit practice, case law affecting auditors, the organisation of an audit and current developments in the practice of auditing.

366. U.K. Taxation II. Loke Hoi-lam, A.C.A., A.C.I.S., A.H.K.S.A. Tuesdays, 7.15–8.45 p.m., starting February 13, 1979. Room 14, Extra-Mural Town Centre, Wing On Centre, 8th floor, 111 Connaught Road Central, Hong Kong. 14 meetings. Fee: \$110

This advanced course will be of value for students taking A.C.C.A. Section 3 Paper 16, or a similar level of examination. It will include the area of Corporation Tax dealing with computation of profits, capital allowance, losses, terminal losses and group relief, Close Companies' Taxation, Treatment of Income Tax and Advance Corporation Tax, and Capital Gains Tax. This course will not cover personal taxation though a revision lecture aiming to bring students up to date with the latest personal tax developments will be given. As only students who have passed a basic taxation examination will be admitted to the course, a photocopy of qualifications should be submitted with the application form.

367. Management Accounting. Peter Y. B. Lam, A.A.S.A. (Senior), Dip. Tech. (W. Aust.), A.C.I.S., A.B.I.A., A.M.B.I.M., F.H.K.S.A. Mondays, 7.45–9.15 p.m., starting February 12, 1979. Room 30, Extra-Mural Town Centre, Wing On Centre, III Connaught Road Central, Hong Kong. 15 meetings.

Fee: \$120

Students will be introduced to various modern management accounting techniques and methods. The syllabus is mainly based on that of the A.C.C.A. and will cover: balance sheet analysis, inter-firm comparisons, budgeting and budgetary control, marginal and differential costings, discounted cash flow, pricing policies, control analysis, and control reporting.

Recommended textbook: Management Accounting by W. M. Harper, Second Edition 1977.

368. Financial Management and Business Finance. Warren Lowe, Dip. Tech. (Comm.), A.A.S.A., A.H.K.S.A. Fridays, 6.15-7.45 p.m., starting February 16, 1979. Room 229, Knowles Building, University of Hong Kong. 14 meetings. Fee: \$110

This course is designed to be helpful to students studying for examinations of the Institute of Chartered Secretaries and Administrators, Certified Accountants and Cost and Management Accountants. Course contents will include capital investment appraisal, cash flow statements, working capital management, inflation and its effect on financial management, valuation of companies, sources of finance, the effect on financial management of Government legislation, and, cost of capital.

The practical aspects of the Company Secretary's job will be described with special reference to the procedures and administration of companies registered under the Hong Kong Companies Ordinance. This course is suitable for students who wish to acquire a basic knowledge of Secretarial Practice for practical use as well as for students taking professional examinations.

Fee: \$100

The general principles and practice relating to company meetings will be considered including such aspects as drawing up of agenda, notices, minutes, voting and proxies and the rights and restrictions regarding the holding of meetings. While the Course is primarily designed to assist students taking professional examinations, it will also be helpful to business executives by providing them with guidelines for conducting more effective meetings.

It is very important that today's accountant should have an appreciation of the principles of effective management and an awareness of the behavioural aspects of accounting. This course will be of value to students taking A.C.C.A. Paper 17, Business Management, or I.C.S.A. Paper 16, Management: Principles and Policy.

Among the topics to be discussed are the setting of objectives and policy making, theories of management, the problems of centralisation-decentralisation, authority, responsibility and delegation, aspects of motivation, communication and the behavioural impact of budgeting.

372. Takeovers and Mergers. S. W. Ching, F.C.C.A., F.C.M.A., F.C.I.S., A.I.B., M.B.I.M., F.H.K.S.A. Tuesdays, 6.00-7.00 p.m., starting starting February 20, 1979. Room 14, Extra-Mural Town Centre, Wing On Centre, 8th floor, 111 Connaught Road Central, Hong Kong. 8 meetings.

Takeovers and mergers appear to be occurring more frequently in Hong Kong. This course will provide an introduction to this complicated area of business life. The advantages and disadvantages will be considered, also the function of the Hong Kong Code on Takeovers and Mergers and the roles of the Securities Commission, the Committee on Takeovers and Mergers and the Stock Exchange regulations. The course will be useful to junior executives in the merchant banking field and will also be of interest to students taking the financial management paper for professional examinations.

Nowadays, it is important for all senior members of a management team to be aware of the financial implications of business decisions and to be able to interpret and apply financial information for the effective performance of their roles. In some situations, such as professional partnerships the non-financial specialist is even required to direct and control finances.

The aim of this course is to provide a means by which non-accountants, particularly members of other professions such as architects and engineers, can provide themselves with an understanding of the principles and techniques of accountancy, the terminology used and also an appreciation of the practical applications of accounting and finance. The first four meetings will cover the topics of Financial Accounting, Management Accounting, Finance and Financial Planning; for the fifth meeting participants will be divided into syndicates and, with the guidance of the tutors, will work through a practical application.

In this second part of the course the tutor will discuss the significance of law cases relating to those aspects of the Inland Revenue Ordinance studied in Part 1. Persons with a basic knowledge of the main tax changes, the provisions relating to personal assessment and the procedures for filing tax returns may also join the course at this stage.

The course is an integrated series of lectures/seminars by experts in the field.

Urban Economics is primarily an attempt to apply economics to the study of the city. This course is therefore designed for those who are interested in applying economic theory to shed light on urban problems. With living examples from Hong Kong, the instructor will try to demonstrate economic forces at work. As "to keep a roof over the heads of the poor" is considered to be the government's undeniable responsibility, it will be shown that "there is no such thing as a free lunch" in our government's housing policies. Topics will include housing problems, transportation problems, pollution and environmental control. Prior knowledge of economics is not essential.

Topics discussed will include: World Trade and Balance-of-Payments Problems and Adjustments, the emergence of Multinational Corporations, the growth of Third World Economic Power, the North-South Dialogue and the demand for a New World Economic Order.

385. The Scope and Method of Marketing Research. Barry. Warrington, M.Sc. (B'ham.), A.M.B.I.M. Mondays, 8.00-9.30 p.m., starting February 12, 1979. Room 22, Extra-Mural Town Centre, Wing On Centre, 8th floor, III Connaught Road Central, Hong Kong. 14 meetings.

Fee: \$120

The course is designed to provide practising managers and those involved in such industries as advertising and marketing with a knowledge of the values and scope of professionally conducted market research activity. The course will examine the scope and method of market research activity, assessing the value of such research in solving marketing problems and establishing a marketing plan. Reference will be made to the role of Internal/Desk Research and External Research, paying particular attention to the role of data collection, analysis and interpretation. Course members will also be introduced to the value of both qualitative as well as quantitative research. Case studies in both Consumer Market Research and Industrial Market Research will form a major element of the course work. Prior statistical knowledge is not essential.

The course is designed for executives in the business and industrial sectors who want to acquire an understanding of economic theory relevant to their business life. The firm will be treated as a decision making unit under various market structures. Topics covered include industrial concentration, economies of scale, industrial demand curve, barrier to entry, diversification and vertical integration. The course is essentially practical and only an elementary knowledge of economics is assumed.

This course is designed for teachers without special mathematical training who wish to learn some basic concepts underlying statistics and sampling methods which are applicable to the field of education. 391. An Introduction to Managerial Techniques. Vincent Ng, B.S., M.B.A., M.S. (UCLA). Wednesdays, 7.45-9.15 p.m., starting February 7, 1979. Room 20, Extra-Mural Town Centre, Wing On Centre, 8th floor, III Connaught Road Central, Hong Kong. 12 meetings. Fee: \$95

Modern managerial activity contains within it elements of both science and art. The evolution of managerial thinking will be examined, including the ideas developed by the Classical, Human Relations, Neo-classical, and Modern Schools of Thought. Attention will also focus on the functions of the executive together with his role in establishing goals and strategy in the business enterprise. A variety of managerial techniques will be considered within the general framework of the need for corporate planning and for decision-making in conditions of uncertainty. Fundamental ideas will be illustrated with practical examples drawn from the financial, marketing and personnel areas of management.

The course will be suitable for young executives without formal

knowledge of the full range of management techniques.

392. Financial Analysis in Business. Gabriel Lee Chi-wang, B.Sc. (HK), M.B.A. (Toronto). Fridays, 7.45-9.15 p.m., starting February 9, 1979. Room 20, Extra-Mural Town Centre, Wing On Centre, 8th floor, 111 Connaught Road Central, Hong Kong. 12 meetings. Fee: \$95

In the conditions of modern business a number of analytical techniques have been developed for solving financial problems within the Company. The theory and practice of such methods will be examined in detail, together with ways of evaluating financial performance, alternative investment opportunities, financial risk and security pricing. The course is designed for junior credit analysts in the fields of banking and finance who wish to gain a greater awareness of modern techniques. It is planned that the course will allow maximum participation by course members in addition to the more formal mode of instruction.

393. Strategy in the Business Enterprise. George M. Docherty, M.Sc (Loughborough), A.C.C.A., A.C.I.S., A.M.B.I.M. Saturdays, 11.15 a.m.—12.45 p.m., starting February 10, 1979. Room 18, Extra-Mural Town Centre, Wing On Centre, 8th floor, 111 Connaught Road Central, Hong Kong. 10 meetings. Fee: \$80

A constant problem of the modern manager is that day-to-day problems so often command attention that the long term, but even more vital, questions of business strategy are ignored. The formulation of business strategy is as important to the established organization as it is to one newly-created. The course has as its focus the frameworks which a businessman may use to make his organization and its contribution more effective. Internal and external criteria will be examined in order to provide the basis of appraisal of current attainment and the longer term direction of effort. The strategic considerations of companies of different size will also be taken into account.

Materials Management is one of the major functions in industrial, commercial and governmental organizations. The term indicates an attempt to manage and control the total flow of materials from selection of supplier, through inventory control into production, and, in certain cases, after processing into the finished product, distribution to the customer.

This course will benefit managers who are responsible for all or part of the purchasing, inventory control or stores activities. Topics covered will include various management techniques which can be applied specifically to the solving of material management problems. 395. Consumer Goods Marketing. Francis A. Chan, B.Sc. (Minnesota), Mondays, 5.45-7.15 p.m., starting February 5, 1979. Room 20, Extra-Mural Town Centre, Wing On Centre, 8th floor, 111 Connaught Road Central, Hong Kong. 10 meetings. Fee: \$80

Successful marketing is the key to business success. The application of the marketing concept makes it necessary that all elements in the organization should have their activities focussed upon the attainment of specific marketing goals. The theory and practice of marketing will be dealt with in detail, including the definition of the market and consumer acceptance, marketing organization, market research, channels of distribution, selling, pricing policies and advertising and sales promotion activity. The tutor will address himself particularly to the problems of marketing consumer goods in the context of Hong Kong. This course is intended for junior executives whether in a specialist marketing area or not and for those engaged in General Management who wish to gain a greater insight into the relevance and working of the marketing function in a business operation.

396. International Marketing. T. R. Ramachandran, M.A. (Madras), Dip. Marketing (Bombay). Fridays, 7.45–9.15 p.m., starting February 9, 1979. Room 415, Knowles Building, University of Hong Kong. 12 meetings.

Fee: Sos

The selling and distribution of products in the overseas market presents a unique challenge to the marketing specialist. In addition to particular economic and financial criteria of such involvement, special attention has to be paid to the plan to open up new markets, modes of decision-making, the measurement of potential and of performance. This course aims to meet the needs of practising executives in business, whose responsibilities embrace overseas markets. The basic principles and problems of international marketing will be illustrated with selected case histories drawn from the recent past.

397. Decision-making in Business: a Model-building Approach. Wong Yat-pui, B.Sc. (H.K.), M.B.A. (Br. Col.). Fridays, 7.15-8.45 p.m., starting February 9, 1979. Room 122, University Main Building. 12 meetings. Fee: \$95

A wide range of quantitative techniques may be applied to the process of taking decisions in the business field. This course is focussed upon the needs of junior and middle managers who wish to gain a deeper insight into the application of statistics and the model-building approach to their functional specialism. An understanding of basic algebra and statistics will be assumed. Special attention will be paid to the techniques of decision-making in conditions of uncertainty, preference theory, network-analysis, discounting methods, linear programming, and regression analysis. Theoretical approaches will be illustrated with case histories.

398. Management Theory and Practice. K. K. Chong, B.Sc. (Eng.), Dip.M.S. (H.K.), A.M.B.I.M. Tuesdays, 6.30-8.00 p.m., starting February 6, 1979. Room 415, Knowles Building, University of Hong Kong. 12 meetings. Fee: \$95

The bridge between soundly-conceived management theory and the problems of the practical manager is the focal point of this course. Theoretical concepts will be examined from the point of view of their applicability in today's business conditions with reference to eastern and western influences on managerial style. The problems of change and the reaction of subordinates to change will be considered. The course is designed to help managers to assess their priorities in the non-technical sphere of administration and to stimulate thinking about modes of effective managerial conduct.

399. Introduction to Operational Research. F. K. W. Mak, Ph.D. (London), C. Eng., M.I.Mech.E. Tuesdays, 8.00-9.30 p.m., starting February 6, 1979. Room 30, Extra-Mural Town Centre, Wing On Centre, 8th floor, III Connaught Road Central, Hong Kong. 12 meetings. Fee: \$90

Operational Research is a most useful technique for all managers and administrators, enabling them to understand and use the more advanced methods of information collection, processing and control which lead to a more efficient organization. Students should have a basic knowledge of algebra but all other mathematical concepts will be explained. The course has been designed to suit those who have no previous knowledge of Operational Research and to act as an introductory course for those who wish to pursue more advanced studies in this area.

400. Personnel Management: a Modern Approach. John Wincott, B.A. (Open), M.A. (Lancaster), M.Inst.M., M.B.I.M. Thursdays, 6.00-7.30 p.m., starting February 8, 1979. Room 418, Knowles Building, University of Hong Kong. 10 meetings. Fee: \$80

The development of sound Personnel Policies is now widely accepted as the cornerstone to the successful pursuit of the overall objectives of an organization. In this course the role of the personnel specialist will be examined in relation to the individual, groups, and the total organization. Specific aspects of personnel policy to be reviewed will include Manpower Planning, Employment, Interview and Selection Techniques, Wage and Salaries Administration and Employee Conditions of Employment. The problems of Incentives, Communications and of Organizational Design will also be considered.

The course will be of interest to junior and middle level executives in the personnel function who wish to broaden their appreciation of the policy options available in their function. 401. An Introduction to Public Administration. Miron Mushkat, B.A. (Tel Aviv), M.A. (Carleton), Ph.D. (Manc.). Fridays, 6.15-7.45 p.m., starting February 9, 1979. Room 722, Knowles Building, University of Hong Kong. 12 meetings. Fee: \$95

The handling of resources and people often presents the Public Sector with the largest problems of management in a society, as well as special considerations such as accountability and responsibility. This course has been designed primarily for Government Officers, who wish to gain deeper insights into the administrative and bureaucratic phenomena of their work. Attention will be given to processes of communication, motivating, leading, planning and decision-making. Specific problems in the fields of personnel administration, financial administration and law will also be examined in the context of the workings of Government.

BUSINESS CORRESPONDENCE

Every business executive needs to be able to express himself clearly and with courtesy when he corresponds with his clients both overseas and locally. The Department's "Business Correspondence" courses are therefore intended for those who have to handle correspondence independently for their organisations and will provide tuition in the following aspects of commercial correspondence:

Basic Principles: lay-out of a business letter, conventional usage,

style and the use and abuse of commercial jargon.

Trade Enquiries: how to make trade enquiries, how to negotiate for

more favourable terms and how to place orders.

Complaints: how to write letters of complaint and to reply to

them.

Sales Letters: how to write sales letters to suit a variety of

different circumstances.

Collection Letters: how to write letters calling for payment when bills

are overdue.

Correspondence how to summarize a series of letters so as to draw Summaries: out the points raised in each letter or in the

out the points raised in each letter or in the correspondence as a whole and how to make recom-

mendations for further action.

Throughout the courses considerable attention will be paid not only what to say to suit different circumstances, but also the implication of expressing oneself in a variety of different ways.

SPOKEN ENGLISH

426. Oral Fluency. Mrs. I. C. Anderson, B.A., Dip.Ed. (Manitoba). Mondays and Wednesdays, 7.15–8.45 p.m., starting February 12, 1979. University of Hong Kong. 16 meetings. Fee: \$140

The focus of this short intensive course is on oral English. Through student participation in role-playing situations, small-group discussions, problem-solving exercises and other activities, the aim of the course will be to improve the students' oral fluency in English. Some attention will be given to pronunciation, intonation and listening comprehension, but the emphasis will be placed on functional communicative competence—the ability and confidence to know what to say and how to say it in situations where spoken English is most likely to be needed.

By showing the contrast in stress and intonation between English and Chinese (Cantonese and Mandarin) the tutor will help the Chinese student to grasp:

428. New Orientations in English Language Teaching. William Cheng, B.A., M.A.(Ed.)(H.K.U.), Dip. in App.Ling.(Edin.), Lecturer, School of Education, Chinese University of Hong Kong. Thursdays, 6.15-7.45 p.m., starting February 15, 1979. Room 103, Main Building, University of Hong Kong. 12 meetings. Fee: \$100

This course will introduce teachers to some of the new developments in English language teaching and their possible impact on syllabus design and classroom procedures. Lectures and discussions will be supported by the showing of films.

The topics to be considered will include the following:

Second language acquisition;

Syllabus design: structural syllabuses versus communicative/functional syllabuses;

Different approaches to the teaching of grammar;

Error analysis;

Developing communicative skills;

Language teaching games and songs;

Communication games and role-play;

New trends in the teaching of reading;

Language testing.

Designing, constructing and using English language tests are essential to all teachers of English. This course will therefore cover the basic notions on language testing, e.g. factors governing a good test; procedures in designing and constructing language tests; the interpretation of test scores; item analysis; subjective and objective testing; discrete-point tests versus integrative skills tests and the influence of a communicative approach on language testing.

Multiple-choice items, the Cloze test and dictation will also be considered in detail as these are the more controversial testing devices at present.

The course will not only help teachers to measure more correctly the language skills of their students and find out where their weaknesses lie, but it is also hoped that the teachers themselves will be able to evaluate and improve their techniques in both testing and teaching.

This course is intended for secondary school teachers of English. Enrolment will be limited to 25 students and may be by selection of those who are most qualified to benefit from the course of tuition.

CULTURAL COURSES

430. Baroque Poetry: A Study in East-West Comparative Literature. T. W. Wong, B.A. (Nat. Taiwan), Ph.D. (Wash.), Lecturer in East-West Comparative Literature, University of Hong Kong. Tuesdays, 6.15-7.45 p.m., starting April 10, 1978. Room 201, Main Building, University of Hong Kong. 10 meetings. Fee: \$90

Historians of European literature have recently adopted the term *Baroque* to describe the period between the Renaissance and the Neoclassicism of eighteenth century literature. This course is therefore offered to introduce the concept of *Baroque* to those who may have only a very limited knowledge of European literature of the seventeenth century.

Seventeenth century European poetry, with examples from Spain, France and Germany read in translation, will be considered with reference to its stylistic idiosyncrasies and how the poets used their creative intellect to reflect the attitude of "life as a dream", how they dramatized their amorous and even sexual experiences and how they expressed their extreme views on Time and Death.

Chinese poetry of the ninth century (Mid and Late T'ang) will be read in translation in the light of Baroque stylistics and sensibilities, and similarities in attitudes towards Love and Death and artistic creation between

T'ang poets and the European Baroque poets will be explored.

As the term *Baroque* was originally used in art criticism, the course will also introduce the works of Baroque artists and musicians. Slides of paintings, sculpture and architecture by Michaelangelo, Bernini, Rembrandt, Rubens etc. will be shown, and recordings of the music of Bach, Handel and Vivaldi etc. will be played. These will serve to show what they share with the writers of their time in attitude and expression of the "age-spirit".

《美學》作爲一門獨立科學是從一七五零年德國哲學家鮑姆嘉通開始的。其實自從人類有藝術創作以來,就十分關心美學上的各種問題,並致力於這些問題的探討和研究。在西方,從古希臘已開始美學的研究,柏拉圖和亞理斯多德這兩位哲學大師就寫過不少美學和詩學的論著,影响後世深遠。

長期以來,美學偏重文藝理論方面,其中亦涉及音樂美學。公元前六世紀中葉哲學家畢達格拉斯認為「音樂使宇宙諧和,一如數學與天文學」;公元前五世紀的柏拉圖主張音樂是社會與政治的教育工具;普羅丁納斯覺得音樂就是神力;而十七世紀的雷布尼茲研究所得到的結論是「音樂是無意識數學之運算」。

哲學家與心理學家對音樂美學的觀點如上所述,而音樂家、音樂理論家的看法另有角度。克萊茲希瑪認為音樂既非繪畫之代替,亦非自然產物,而是一篇精緻、優美絕倫之詩歌、散文。十九世紀德國音樂理論家雨果·瑞曼則認為音樂作品是作曲者與聽衆之間的媒介。另外一派則認為音樂是純藝術,音樂應有力、優美、親切、富於情感。漢斯利克、哈爾姆、庫爾特、賀爾曼、姚德等十九世紀音樂理論家極力主張摒除情感與幻想,音樂作品只是聲音移動之形態的結果。

《音樂美學》課程將探討上述各點以及音樂作品與聽衆之間的關係。

517. 宗教哲學導論

人類往往因為感應到生命裏的痛苦、死亡、罪俗、空虛等問題而反省 人生意義,尋求宗教。本課程旨在了解宗教與人生的密切關係,透過發掘各 種原始宗教的诗色和意義去澄清傳統理論對圖際(TOTEMISM)、巫術、 肥沃文化宗教(FERTILITY CULT)等的誤解,並闡釋自原始宗教到系統 宗教的發展過程。

課程內容特別着重和提供近代分析工具, 檢討宗教的出現, 演變和 (特別是基督教)分裂分化。整體的探討將有助於明瞭宗教在人類文明的地位,它在社會制度中担當的角色,及對我們的思想和人生觀的影响。

518. 歐洲哲學史:希臘至近代

本課程旨在透過對歐洲哲學史之討論,使學員能得以對哲學之發展有一全面的掌握,並可從哲學史中各哲學禮系對哲學問題之承接及形變上,重新得以對哲學的基本問題及方法有一正確的理解及認識。此課程除了從哲學體系的歷史性着手外,並採納近代之「文獻結構分析」(TEXTUAL ANALYSIS)來揭示及離散(DISSEMINATE)哲學禮系所隱蔽了的形上學壓制式的結構。本課程除了著重哲學內部之問題及方法外,更關注及各哲學禮系對其當代文化之影響,內容如下:

- (一)希臘哲學:如柏拉圖、亞里士多德等。
- (二)中古時期:如奧古斯丁、多瑪斯等。
- (三)理性主義及經驗主義:如笛卡兒、斯賓諾沙、來布尼茲、貝克 萊及休謨等。

- (五)近代哲學:如現象學、存在主義、記號學、結構主義等。
- (六)近代反哲學:馬克思理論、心理分析、尼采、海德格、 DER-RIDA、FOUCAULT 及 DELEUZE。

523. China, Indochina, and ASEAN: Conflict and Competition in Southeast Asia. Brian C. Shaw, B.A. (Hons.) (Wellington), Ph.D. (ANU), Lecturer in Political Science, University of Hong Kong, and member, International Institute for Strategic Studies (London). Wednesdays, 6.15-7.45 p.m., starting February 28, 1979. Room 847, Knowles Building, University of Hong Kong. 8 meetings. Fee: \$65

The more vigorous involvement of China in the international arena, serious Sino-Vietnamese differences, and the Vietnam-Cambodia interstate conflict, are only three of the important developments since April 1975 that have encouraged optimistic forecasts for the economic and political maturation of the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN). Whether these forecasts are reasonably based, and whether the Sino-Vietnamese conflict is amenable to accommodation, are important and complex issues affecting the prospects for short- and middle-term stability in Southeast Asia as a whole. The region, in turn, cannot be torn from global economic and political considerations (including the interests—declared or undeclared—of the Super-Powers). These lectures briefly survey developments since April 1975 in the international politics of the area, and discuss the above-mentioned issues and others, in some depth.

524. Mao Tse-tung's Thoughts in East-West Perspective. Alfred H. Y. Lin, M.Phil. (H.K.), Ph.D. (London) and John D. Young, M.A., Ph.D. (California). Mondays, 6.15-7.45 p.m., starting April 30, 1979. Room 103, University Main Building. 8 meetings. Fee: \$65

The purpose of this course is to introduce Mao Tse-tung's Thoughts in their totality through examining their origins, characteristics, manifestations and influence on Chinese society. Is the Thought of Mao Tse-tung something from China's past, or is it an entirely new political-philosophical system? To what extent is it Marxist-Leninist? The aim here is to explain the patterns behind modern day Chinese politics. The relevance of Mao's Thought on the future of China's development will also be discussed.

526. Basic Principles of Computer Systems. F. T. Chan, B.Sc. Fridays, 6.00-7.00 p.m., 7.15-8.15 p.m., starting February 16, 1979. Room 10, Central Market Building, Top floor, Hong Kong. 12 meetings. Fee: \$100

This course aims to provide an explanation of how computer systems operate. It is designed for people who have no previous knowledge of computers and is especially suitable for people thinking of taking up data processing as a career, as well as those employees whose work involves contact with computer systems. It may be considered as a preliminary to the 'Certificate Course in Digital Computer Programming'.

The syllabus will include: number systems and elementary arithmetic procedures; data processing organisation chart; the nature of data processing systems; input; storage; processing; control; output; input/output units; storage units; central processing and control; methods of processing, batch processing; random access; real time.

527. Fundamentals of Computer Systems & Data Processing. T. Y. Chen, B.Sc., M.Sc., M.Phil., D.I.C., M.B.C.S., Lecturer in Computer Science, University of Hong Kong, F. T. Chan, B.Sc. and P. T. Ho, B.Sc. (Eng.). Wednesdays and Fridays, 6.15-8.30 p.m., starting February 7, 1979. Room 150, Main Building, University of Hong Kong. 40 meetings.

The syllabus will include: basic components of a computer; storedprogram computer; systems software; logic operators; hardware concepts; concepts of input/output device control; data structures—lists, trees, etc.; file organizations and their processing; sorting techniques; concepts of programming languages; numerical methods; simple statistics; modelling and simulation.

It will be very helpful to those who are preparing to sit for the Part I examination of the British Computer Society, as this course covers most of the syllabus of the Part I General Papers.

Applicants must have knowledge of at least one high level programming language such as FORTRAN, COBOL etc. They should have passed 5 subjects including English and Mathematics at Grade E or above in the Hong Kong Certificate of Education, or equivalent.

Enrolment is limited to 25 persons.

528. Basic Geology and the Geology of Hong Kong. M. J. Atherton, B.Sc., D.I.C., M.H.K.I.E., F.G.E., Lecturer in Engineering Geology, Hong Kong Polytechnic. Tuesdays, 6.30-8.30 p.m., starting February 13, 1979. Room 237, Geography Department (Main Building), University of Hong Kong. 10 meetings. Fee: \$100

A study of basic geological processes including structural geology, mineralogy and petrology, followed by a consideration of the geology of

Hong Kong.

The course is intended for secondary school teachers and interested laymen and a previous knowledge of geology is not essential. Rock specimens will be shown throughout the course and there will be two full day field trips at weekends, the cost of which is not included in the fee.

529. Flora of Hong Kong: Some Aspects of Medicinal Plants. Lee Yin-tsee, B.Sc. (C.U.H.K.), Ph.D. (California), Mercer Fellow, Arnold Arboretum (Harvard University). Thursdays, 6.15-7.15 p.m., starting February 15, 1979. Room 14, Extra-Mural Town Centre, Wing On Centre, 8th floor, III Connaught Road Central. 8 meetings. Fee: \$50

This course will include a consideration of the commoner Families of Hong Kong Flowering Plants with particular emphasis on those used in Chinese medicine. Some reference will also be made to local poisonous plants. Colour slide transparencies will be used to illustrate the plants wherever possible. If sufficient interest is shown, some field trips will be arranged.

530. Fungi and Man. D. A. Griffiths, B.Sc., Ph.D., D.Sc., Professor of Botany, University of Hong Kong. Tuesdays, 7.00-8.00 p.m., starting February 13, 1979. Northcote Science Building, Department of Botany, Lecture Room 302. 10 meetings. Fee: \$50

A course intended for both the layman-naturalist as well as teachers of biology. The course will involve the minimum of biochemistry necessary to understand certain metabolic reactions and will be geared to the informed naturalist rather than to specialist mycologists. Stress will be laid on Hong Kong Fungi where this is possible and will also outline some of the research being carried out in this field in various institutes in the colony.

The course will include the following topics: History of mycology (the scientific study of fungi); Folklore and fungi from Greek and Roman times; modern approaches to fungal classification; the useful larger fungi such as mushrooms; the poisonous fungi and aspects of fungal toxicology; deleterious effects of fungi in man's world—biodeterioration, plant diseases, animal and human mycoses (fungal diseases); the yeasts in brewing and baking.

Wherever possible the course will be illustrated with demonstrations of

available material in the laboratory.

531. Marine Life and the Effects of Pollution in Hong Kong. D. J. H. Phillips, B.A. (Cantab), Research Officer in Marine Pollution, Fisheries Research Station, Hong Kong. Thursdays, 7.30-9.00 p.m., starting February 15, 1979. Room 14, Extra-Mural Town Centre, Wing On Centre, 8th floor, III Connaught Road Central, Hong Kong. 6 meetings. Fee: \$45

A general introduction to the marine life of Hong Kong will include discussion of the different marine habitat types and their fauna and flora. The hydrology and oceanography of Hong Kong waters will be referred to briefly. A consideration of dangerous or poisonous marine life found in Hong Kong will be included and the topics will be illustrated by colour slides wherever possible.

Consideration of the effects of pollution on the marine life of Hong Kong will include both domestic and industrial pollution; emphasis will be given to methods of monitoring pollution and to the current situation in Hong Kong waters.

532. Introduction to Gemstones & Gemmology. D. Healey, B.Sc., Ph.D. (Lond.), F.G.A. (Lond.), Lecturer in Physics, University of Hong Kong. Fridays, 7.15–8.45 p.m., starting February 16, 1979. Roon 121, Main Building, University of Hong Kong. 8 meetings. Fee: \$60

A course designed for the interested layman which may also be of use to professionals studying for the first year papers of the Gemmological Association of Great Britain. Emphasis will be placed on methods of distinguishing between natural and synthetic gems.

Topics to be covered include: Natural gems; description and origin. Crystal structure and physical properties. Hardness, refractive index, double refraction, specific gravity, dichroism, spectra, fluorescence. Production and properties of synthetic and immitation gems. New diamond simulants: YAG, GGG, Cubic zirconia.

Topics on haemopoietic system of the body, excitation and contraction of the heart, blood pressure, blood flow and the intrinsic control mechanism on circulation will be discussed. When applicable, the lectures will be illustrated by demonstrations with animals.

This course is designed to introduce parents and future parents to a body of practical knowledge about children's education from birth to six. Topics will include: the absorbent mind, sensitive periods, sequential learning, movement and learning, selection of educational material (toys), the home as a prepared environment, educational milestones from birth to six.

Parents will be introduced to observation techniques and will be asked to make a series of guided observations of young children during the course. Course participants are invited to bring problems of child rearing to class for purpose of discussion and problem solving using the Montessori approach.

Teachers, social workers and others, working in kindergartens, child care centres, residential homes etc., whose duties bring them into daily contact with young children up to the age of six, will be introduced to the Montessori method, which is heavily based on the observation of young children. Guided observations of such children will therefore form an important element of the course.

Topics to be discussed will include: Montessori philosophy; sensorial education; the 3 Selfs—self-motivation, self-teaching, self-discipline; sequential learning, movement and learning; prepared environment; the

teacher; ground rules; and preparation of learning materials.

Participants will be involved in developing educational kits utilizing Montessori principles. The first hour will be generally devoted to lectures and the second hour devoted to discussion and demonstration.

544. The Sociology of Education and Educational Policy & Planning. Mrs. Susan Balloch, B.Sc., M.Sc. (L.S.E.), formerly Senior Lecturer in Political Sociology, University of London, Consultant in Education at OECD. Thursdays, 6.00-7.30 p.m., starting February 22, 1979. The Sociology of Education is concerned with the complicated relationships that exist between a "society" and its formal educational system, i.e. schools, colleges, universities, and with the social relationships created within or introduced into that system. Such relationships may not always support education's proclaimed values or the learning process.

With this in mind, this course will examine the origins and nature of modern methods of mass schooling and the relationship of formal education to the family, social class, social mobility, the economy and politics. Pupil and teacher roles will also come under discussion and be related to teaching

as a 'profession'.

Research into these areas has provided a tentative 'knowledge base' for those concerned with education. An attempt will be made to relate this base to the formulation of educational policy and planning and to define some of the directions in which education might proceed in the future.

Fee Refund: Teachers who wish to attend this course may apply for a half fee refund from the Director of Education as soon as they receive a letter of acceptance from the Department of Extra-Mural Studies. This applies to all teachers whether in Government, aided or private schools.

545. Social Policy and Social Services in China Today. Suzanne Pepper, M.A. Ph.D. (Berkeley). Wednesdays, 7.15-8.45 p.m., starting February 21, 1979. Room 16, Extra-Mural Town Centre, Wing On Centre, 8th floor, III Connaught Road Central, Hong Kong. 9 meetings. Fee: \$75

The provision of social services became an integral part of the Chinese Communists' political programme before 1949 and remains so today. But in trying to build socialism in a nation that is still primarily agricultural, the Chinese must find the means both to industrialise their economy and to provide social security for their people. Hence the continuing importance of self-reliance and self-help at the local level in the Chinese system.

Topics for discussion will include: education, health care, the prevention and treatment of crime, the status of women, income maintenance, housing, social welfare and the care of the aged. Each lecture will focus on three specific questions: achievements since 1949; methods and programmes responsible for these achievements; problems and future tasks.

Guest speakers will be invited to participate where possible.

課程包括學校社會工作之目的、方式及發展趨向;目前香港社工的發展;學校辦社工之條件和方法;社工人員、教師、行政人員、家長及其他專業人員之間的關係;教師與社工人員之分工與合作;就學靑少年的發展過程,需要及常遇之難題;個案之研究;在學校中如何運用社會工作方法——包括個人、小組及社區的工作形式,技巧及社會資源的運用等。

Certificate in Housing Management

The aim is to provide a local qualification in Housing Management for people already working in the field and the course is intended to provide a firm grounding in the theory and practice of housing management.

The standard and content of the course and its examinations are designed to be the equivalent of the Diploma in Housing Management sponsored by the United Kingdom Institute of Housing. The syllabus is related to that of the Institute but is strongly geared to local relevance.

The course runs over three academic years. Year I prepares candidates for the Intermediate Examination and Years II and III for the Final Examinations.


