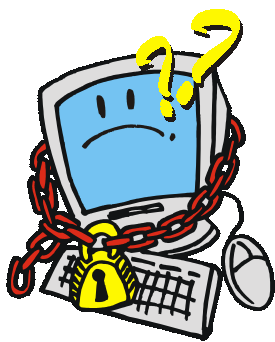

- Marksmanship
- Decision Making



Marksmanship

- Three firearms practices annually
- Passing score 75% hit on target at annual qualifying test



Decision Making

- Follow the Police General Orders guidelines
 - Arrest suspected person that commits violent and serious crime
 - Protect anyone from serious bodily injury
 - Quell a riot
 - Avoid shooting at crowd or hostage etc.
 - As last resort, unless there is no lesser degree of forces can achieve the above
