<p><i>(Please provide a brief bio of yourself, indicating how your research profile is related to diversity)</i></p> <p>Graduated from University of Edinburgh in 1993, William completed General Practice (GP) Vocational Training at <i>Guy's and St. Thomas' Hospital</i>, London acquiring higher academic qualifications in 1998. He speaks fluent in English, Cantonese and Putonghua. He has extensive hospital and community experience having worked in England, Scotland, Australia, China and Hong Kong.</p> <p>Research He has published 90 manuscripts in peer-reviewed journals including <i>British Medical Journal, Social Science & Medicine, Sociology of Health & Illness, Epidemiology & Community Health, Family Practice, British Journal of General Practice, Sexually Transmitted Diseases, Sexually Transmitted Infections (STI)</i>. He conducts research into health beliefs and behaviour in primary care and public health, and his approach essentially translates research findings into clinical services and community settings. His research interests reflect the breath and diverse nature of primary care, but principally focused on sexual health, health equity and health promotion. He's strong links with many international and Chinese universities and institutions and, was invited to be a temporary advisor for WHO on transgender and HIV/ STI health.</p> <p>So far he has been awarded as the Principle Investigator external competitive research grants equivalent to HK\$9 million including RGC, HK and AIDS Trust Fund; commissioned projects from Food & Health Bureau, Hong Kong SAR Government and from General Practice Education & Training funded directly from the Australian Government, in addition to other grants of over HK\$10 million with his active facilitation as a Co-investigator. The results of his work were disseminated to the general public through 47 newspaper reports and, radio (including BBC World Service) and TV interviews.</p>
